EDINBORO STUDENTS BUILD HABITAT FOR HUMANITY HOME IN NORTH CAROLINA

While thousands of college students were spending their spring break in sunny Florida, a group from Edinboro University of Pennsylvania's residence life and housing staff endured rain and cool temperatures to build a house for a needy family in Cape Fear, North Carolina. The 10 students and two staff and faculty members took part in a Habitat for Humanity project, March 6-13, building floors, walls and the roof, and installing doors and windows.

Joining the Edinboro contingent were 11 students from Eureka College in Illinois, and two students from the University of North Carolina - Greensboro. Not only did the volunteers give up their free time to work on the project, each one chipped in or raised \$150 to help defray the cost of building materials. They were housed in the basement of the St. Andrew Covenant Presbyterian Church in Wilmington, and area churches provided most of their meals.

The University provided two vans for the trip and two advisers. The residence life staff organized the trip and the Student Government Association contributed \$500.

Beth Shick, an Edinboro University residence hall coordinator, said students got a lot out of working on the project for a good cause. "It was an incredible experience to watch the house come up in front of our eyes," said Shick. When the students arrived on the first day, only part of the foundation was in place. By the end of the week the roof and exterior walls of the house were up and some of the interior was taking shape.

Laura Paul, a senior from Edinboro, was one of the assistant residence hall coordinators who organized the trip. She said all of the students took turns in most facets of the construction – digging, nailing, sawing and even laying down the concrete foundation.

Working alongside with them was the single mother who would be moving into the house. "The best part was knowing you were down there helping someone," said Paul.

Meeting the family who would live in the house and seeing who would benefit from their work was a very emotional experience for the volunteers. Before leaving North Carolina, everyone signed his or her name on the house.

Despite the inconvenience of sleeping on cots and sharing two showers among 30 people, Paul said she would do it again and is already helping to plan next year's trip and other projects for Edinboro's Habitat for Humanity chapter.



AREA UNIVERSITIES ANNOUNCE PROJECT HERO

In an unprecedented collaboration, area colleges today announce the creation of Project HERO (Humanitarian Emergency Relief Operation), a broad-based, community-wide effort to raise funds for Kosovar refugees through the Greater Erie County Chapter of the American Red Cross and the International Institute of Erie.

The presidents of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania, Mercyhurst College, and officials from Allegheny College join with representatives of the Red Cross and the Institute to announce the start of Project HERO and light a unity candle to signify the coalition's goal of bringing together all of northwestern Pennsylvania in a common humanitarian effort.

Project HERO will aid Kosovar refugees directly in the Kosovar region by raising funds for the Red Cross's international relief efforts. HERO will also help the Kosovar refugees who come to the Erie area by raising money and supplies for the International Institute. The two relief agencies were chosen to help refugees both locally and abroad, and give contributors a choice of where they would like their funds to go.

The initial goal of Project HERO is to raise \$50,000, but the coalition believes as interest in the cause grows, significantly more money will be raised. Contributors will be asked to make their donations directly by check to either the Red Cross or the International Institute, and to write "Project HERO" in the memo section of the check. That will tell both agencies where the money is to go and will also make it possible to track which funds have been raised through Project HERO.

One of the things that makes project HERO unique is its plan to invite others to become equal "HERO Partners." Any group or any person can become a HERO partner: businesses, corporations, educational institutions, religious and civic organizations. Each partner will be encouraged to stage or support fund-raising events of their own choosing. For example, the colleges and universities will be asking their student organizations to develop fund-raising events in their campus communities.

A third way to support Project HERO is through collection canisters. The coalition hopes to place canisters at dozens of public locations around the region where on-the-spot cash contributions can be made.

While cash donations are the best way to support Project HERO, the International Institute is in urgent need of other support as well. To meet the needs of the refugees once they arrive in northwestern Pennsylvania, the Institute is seeking housing, furnishings, storage space, personal care items and school supplies. Specifically, the Institute is looking for beds and bedding, furniture and major appliances, and simple things like toasters, dishes and silverware. It also needs storage space to house those items and assistance in their delivery. The Institute is also interested in contacts from people who can speak Albanian.

AREA COLLEGES AND UNIVERSITIES ANNOUNCE PROJECT HERO

A coalition of colleges and universities from northwestern Pennsylvania yesterday announced the creation of Project HERO (Humanitarian Emergency Relief Operation) to raise money for the Kosovar refugees. The three schools – Allegheny College, Edinboro University of Pennsylvania, and Mercyhurst College – will work with the American Red Cross and the International Institute in Erie, Pennsylvania, to provide funds for the relief efforts in the Kosovo region, and support Kosovar refugees who will be relocated in northwestern Pennsylvania.

Making the announcement were Edinboro President Frank G. Pogue; Mercyhurst President William Garvey; Allegheny College's Director of Public Affairs Mary Norton; the Director of Development and Public Relations for the Greater Erie County Chapter of the American Red Cross, Sheridan Stricker-Caughlan; and the Executive Director of the International Institute, Michael Murnock.

The participants marked the announcement by lighting a unity candle to represent the coming together of the schools in a common humanitarian effort.

Pogue said any person, group, business or religious organization can join the coalition as a "HERO Partner." Edinboro will be sending out hundreds of letters inviting others to join the coalition.

The initial fund-raising goal of Project HERO is \$50,000, but the members believe the total could be much greater.

"Philanthropy is an American tradition," said Garvey. "The Erie community is a generous one, which is why we feel this will be a success."

The colleges will be calling upon their students to take up Project HERO as one of their community service projects when they return to school in the fall. The more than 10,000 students at Mercyhurst and Edinboro alone put in some 70,000 volunteer hours last year.

Pogue believes the needs of the refugees will be with us for many, many years. Even if the reported peace settlement in Yugoslavia should be a lasting one, it will take a long time for the refugees to rebuild their homes and their lives.

"We're talking about a long-term venture here," said Pogue.

EDINBORO UNIVERSITY OF PENNSYLVANIA ANNOUNCES KIDS ACADEMY AT PORRECO

Edinboro University of Pennsylvania will host the Kids Academy at Porreco (KAP) with two summer programs at Edinboro University in Erie – The Porreco Center, July 24-28 and July 31-August 4. Offering a wide variety of unique learning experiences, children in grades one through six may register for full- or half-day programs in one or both weeks.

With classes divided into grades 1-3 and 4-6, each grade is taught a series of four different classes each week. During the July 24-28 session, the youngest children will explore parachutes, kites, gliders and powered aircraft in "Things That Fly." They will create jungle creatures in 2D and 3D form and learn about the animals in "Lions & Tigers & Bears." "FunWith Art" explores a variety of materials and ideas, while "Kaleidoscope of Colors" uses color as a primary source to create activities such as a tye-dye project and a kaleidoscope. Grades 4-6 will draw, paint and sculpt horses in "Horses, Horses, Everywhere," and explore "Fun With Art." "Discovering Ancient Egypt" involves hands-on projects to enhance students understanding of this past civilization. They will study surrealism and learn to draw and paint a surrealistic art piece "Art of Surrealism".

In the second session, July 31-August 4, grades 1-3 will explore wildlife from bees to bears during Pennsylvania Wildlife." They will participate in team and individual sports activities during "Self-Esteem/Physical Fitness," and develop the skill to recognize pattern, texture, shapes and compositional qualities in "Plants and Tiny Creatures in Art." Students will create puppets and present a puppet show based on Aesop's Fables in "Puppetry." Grades 4-6 will also participate in "Self-Esteem/Physical Fitness" and "Pennsylvania Wildlife." The nutritional value of foods and how to meet nutritional needs will be explored in "Fun with Food." Activities to assist with the math concepts of measurement and obtain averages or "mean's" will be presented in "Math is Fun."

Children will be escorted between classes and will be supervised at all times. The fee for each full week, full-day program is \$125 for the first child and \$105 for additional children from the same family in the same week. The fee for each half-day (morning or afternoon) is \$90 per week, \$75 for additional children from the same family in the same week. All children will receive a KAP souvenir.

EDINBORO, MANSFIELD UNIVERSITIES OFFER DEGREE VIA VIDEO TO ELK AND CAMERON COUNTIES

Residents of rural northwestern Pennsylvania will soon be able to earn a college degree in criminal justice locally thanks to an agreement between two State System of Higher Education universities and the Community Education Council of Elk and Cameron Counties.

Edinboro University of Pennsylvania and Mansfield University of Pennsylvania are collaborating to offer an associate of science degree in criminal justice administration at the Education Council's facilities in St. Marys, Pa. The courses will be taught via interactive video from Mansfield and Edinboro with Mansfield offering all of the criminal justice courses and Edinboro providing the general education courses from its facilities at Edinboro University in Erie – The Porreco Center.

The degree will be a part-time evening program offered over a period of four years. Two courses will be offered each fall and spring semester. A student enrolling when the program begins in the fall of 1999 could receive his or her associate degree in 2003.

The program will prepare students to work in probation, parole, drug enforcement, security and investigation, and meet the minimum 60 credit hours now required by the Pennsylvania State Police.

Edinboro's Dean of Liberal Arts, Dr. Terry Smith, said the program combines the quality of Edinboro and Mansfield courses with the convenience of holding the classes in St. Marys.

EDINBORO'S ON-TRACK PROGRAM TARGETS RURAL WOMEN STUDENTS

More than 70 students from rural high schools in northwestern Pennsylvania will take part in a program June 27 – July 1 at Edinboro University of Pennsylvania designed to prepare and motivate rural students for a college education.

The On-Track program will help students – especially women – become aware of their academic and career potentials, opportunities and resources. This year's program has grown to 32 rural high schools participating with students entering their sophomore, junior and senior year in the fall.

Faculty, staff and students will introduce the five-day program that will feature several daily seminars on topics such as career assessment, team building, and mind/body connections. Students will learn how to manage stress more effectively through art therapy techniques. They will be exposed to diversity issues on a college campus, attend a planetarium show and experience hands-on activities in the art department.

In addition to the scheduled courses, participants will also be able to select self-interest groups in the areas of loss and separation, eating disorders, peer relations and influences, substance abuse and dealing with stress.

The evenings will be spent in recreational activities, including a boat ride and catered picnic at Presque Isle, karaoke, and line-dancing.

Amanda King, a graduate of Saegertown High School, participated in the 1992 On-Track program prior to entering eleventh grade. She had no idea what she was going to do when she graduated. "After attending the On-Track program," King said, "I understood my personality and


what I should do with my future. I highly recommend the program to any student who is looking for direction." King is now a junior at Edinboro University majoring in secondary English education.



DIXON GIFTS EDINBORO \$150,000 FOR NEW DISABLED COMPLEX

A \$150,000 gift from the Widener Memorial Foundation in Aid of Handicapped Children will bring students with disabilities at Edinboro University of Pennsylvania one step closer to a new learning and recreation complex.

Edinboro University President Frank G. Pogue has announced that the University's request for special Widener Memorial Foundation support was fully funded by the Foundation's trustees at their spring meeting in Lafeyette Hill, Pa.

Notifying Pogue of the gift was the Foundation's President, F. Eugene Dixon, Jr. Dixon is also chairman of the Board of Governors of the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education.

The \$150,000 will go toward funding an elevator and special access ramp in Edinboro's planned Crawford Center for Health and Physical Education and Disabilities Resources. When completed, the new Crawford Center will add more than 27,000 square feet of new construction and renovate 23,000-plus square feet in what is now Crawford Gymnasium. The proposed annex will house the University's Office for Students with Disabilities and facilities which serve the instructional, athletic, recreational and rehabilitational needs of those students.

The Widener Memorial Foundation normally makes grants to organizations located in Pennsylvania's Delaware Valley area for the care of orthopedically handicapped children.

"Because of the reputation of Edinboro University and its tremendous support for students with disabilities, the members of the Foundation board decided to make an exception to our geographical requirement and fully fund Edinboro's request," Dixon said.

"You have made my year," Pogue told Dixon when telephoned about the approved funding.

HIGH SCHOOL JUNIORS TO TAKE PART IN EDINBORO UNIVERSITY'S ERIE/MEADVILLE PARTNERSHIP SUMMER PROGRAM

Students from high schools in Erie and Crawford counties will take part this summer in a two-week college preparation program at Edinboro University of Pennsylvania. Between 35 and 40 students who will be juniors this fall at East, Central, Strong Vincent, Meadville and Cochranton high schools will take part in the Erie/Meadville Partnership, July 15-17, at Edinboro.

The Partnership is a three-phase program designed to prepare academically promising students for college careers. The first phase – the Rising Juniors Program – is the one taking place at Edinboro this summer. It is intended for high school juniors who are B and C students who show interest and ability in college.

The Edinboro program will stress activities that require teamwork such as an outdoor challenge program and camping out along French Creek. Other activities will include science, ceramics, an environmental program, and a karate session to teach discipline. The students will make field trips to Presque Isle and the Maritime Museum in Erie.

One of the program's coordinators, elementary education professor Mary Jo Campbell, said the program emphasizes building character, self-esteem and capitalizing on the skills the students already have. The other coordinator is history professor Umeme Sababu.

For the Partnership's third season – the Collegiate Summer – those students who choose to attend a university in the State System of Higher Education enroll in a regular summer school session to take college

With the arrival this week of one Kosovar refugee family and the anticipated arrival of several more this month, Project HERO is issuing an appeal on behalf of the International Institute of Erie for supplies and funding. Institute Executive Director Michael Murnock said beds and storage space are especially needed. "We need bed frames as well as mattresses," said Murnock, "and we need some additional room to store them."

Project HERO (Humanitarian Emergency Relief Operation) is a coalition of Allegheny College, Edinboro University of Pennsylvania and Mercyhurst College which formed to raise money for the Kosovar refugees through the Greater Erie County Chapter of the American Red Cross and the International Institute.

Murnock said funds are also needed immediately to purchase used beds when donated beds are not available. Even with cash contributions, there may not be enough used beds on the market and new beds are prohibitively expensive. That is why Project HERO is making a public appeal. What makes the appeal critical is a number of refugee families may be arriving at the same time.

EDINBORO UNIVERSITY HONORS SEVEN ALUMNI

Seven Edinboro University of Pennsylvania graduates were recently named distinguished alumni at a special luncheon ceremony highlighting the school's 1999 Alumni Reunion Weekend.

Honored were artist and professor Donna Arnink, artist and retired teacher Vernon Dornbach, Patricia Czyrnik Boord of the FBI Academy, Edinboro University professor Dr. Charles Babbitt, educator and founder of Pennsylvania's first Charter School James Gentile, former Reagan cabinet-level appointee Dorothy Jean Benish Potter, and Bradford schools administrator and community activist David Sheneman.

In addition to traditional college classes, artist and art educator DONNA ARNINK, '68, has taught elementary and secondary students, adult learners and senior citizens. Currently a tenured professor at Colorado College in Colorado Springs, her career in education included positions at Michigan State, Penn State, and at Bedford College in London. She is credited with developing an innovative approach to makeup for theater, film and television which she describes in her book, *Creative Theatrical Makeup*, published by the Michigan State University Press. Arnink has worked on more than 200 dance, opera and theatrical productions and has collaborated with theatrical artists famous in their fields from around the world.

Over his 40-year career in art education, former Fulbright Scholar VERNON DORNBACH, '44, taught all ages, from grades 1-12 in New Zealand, to junior and senior high in Pennsylvania, and Elderhostel in California. After 17 years as a professor, department chair and gallery director at California's University of Redlands, Dornbach retired in 1986. Redlands honored him with an endowed art scholarship in his name upon retirement. He continues to paint, do volunteer work, present slide lectures, and hike the canyons of Arizona and Utah.

Although PATRICIA CZYRNIK BOORD, '77, graduated from Edinboro with a degree in music education and the idea of becoming a musician and conductor, in 1979 she accepted an appointment as a file clerk with the FBI in Washington, D.C. After working as a document classification specialist and writer/editor for the Firearms Training Unit, she was transferred in 1985 to the FBI Academy's Firearms Training Unit to assume responsibility for the statistical analysis of FBI shooting incidents. After a 1986 Miami shooting incident in which several FBI agents were killed and wounded, Boord's analysis served as the foundation upon which the FBI modified firearms training tactics and upgraded the weaponry issued to special agents. In 1988 she was appointed to the faculty of the FBI Academy as a senior instructional systems specialist, and in 1996 was transferred to the FBI's National Security Division where she is responsible for building and managing the Bureau's distance learning program. She now serves as the FBI's leading distance learning expert and provides consultation to numerous domestic and foreign government agencies, law enforcement organizations and branches of the military.

Sociologist and professor Dr. CHARLES BABBITT, '63, started his teaching career at Northwestern High School in Albion, Pa., where he also coached football. After teaching at Buffalo's Canisius College, Erie County Community College in Williamsville, N.Y., and summers at Penn State-Behrend, he returned to Edinboro in 1971 as an assistant professor of sociology. He has since served on and chaired countless committees and boards, provided consultant work, and served as chair of Edinboro's department of sociology/anthropology/social work and sociology program director. He has held visiting professor and scholar appointments in Austria, China, Pakistan, Taiwan, the University of California at Berkeley, and at the Curry School of Education at the University of Virginia.

Former salesman, truck driver, laborer, 1979 National Armwrestling Champion, football star and coach, and teacher JAMES GENTILE, '68, is the founder and CEO of Keystone Education Center, Inc., Pennsylvania's first charter school. He began his career in education teaching at schools in Pennsylvania and Ohio, and became involved in the field of alternative education in 1987 at George Junior Republic in Grove City, Pa. In 1993 he founded Keystone Adolescent Center, Inc., a private children and youth agency which is said to be the Commonwealth's largest community-based home. In 1997 he founded Keystone Education Center, Inc., the first school in Pennsylvania to receive charter school designation. He now serves as president and CEO of both corporations. The school provides educational alternatives

that address the needs of a wide variety of students who have difficulty functioning in the traditional public school environment. Two of Gentile's four sons, Mike and Matt, are employed at Keystone. Both are Edinboro alumni and, like their father, were star football players.

Former Pennsylvania Teacher of the Year DOROTHY JEAN BENISH POTTER, '69, taught students from kindergarten through college in both Pennsylvania and West Virginia before accepting the position of director of early childhood education for the state of West Virginia in 1971. After two months of national-level service as deputy assistant secretary of elementary and secondary education, she was asked by President Ronald Reagan to serve as acting assistant secretary of education, a post she held for two years. In a ten-year period, she went from being a kindergarten teacher to managing all of the nation's elementary and secondary schools. Today, she finds great joy in creating a variety of children's learning tools and writing books.

The recipient of the 1999 Distinguished Alumni Award for Public Service is DAVID SHENEMAN, '64, who has dedicated his professional life to the Bradford (Pa.) Area School District. Beginning his career there as an art instructor, he has held the positions of administrative assistant to the principal, assistant principal for student conduct and attendance, technology administrator, acting superintendent, and director of personnel and administration, a position he has held since 1977. Active in community service, he is the past president of the Pennsylvania Association of School Administrators, the Bradford Rotary Club and the Grace Lutheran Church, as well as first vice president and past campaign chairman of the Bradford Area United Way. While president of the Edinboro University Alumni Association, he oversaw the design and construction of the Alumni House, which was dedicated in 1995. Three \$25,000 Dean's Scholarships and an annual \$40,000 Admissions Scholarship were also established during his presidency.

EDINBORO INTERNS PLAN AREA SENIOR TOURISM PROGRAM

Tourism in northwestern Pennsylvania is getting a boost this summer thanks to a grant from the Pennsylvania Department of Aging, the offices of Active Aging in Meadville and four marketing students from Edinboro University of Pennsylvania.
