

#### OUTLOOK

Swimming, as a varsity intercollegiate sport, was established at Bloomsburg in the Fall of 1959. Although the Husky mermen were winless in 1959 (0-7) and 1960 (0-6), the squad made steady progress, and fans are hoping that this year the swimmers will gain recognition in collegiate ranks. Of the nine returning lettermen, only one—co-captain Tom Little, is a senior. Of the seven new candidates, one is a sophomore and six are freshmen.

A pre-season training program of three weeks, under the supervision of co-captain Nelson Swarts, has helped the Huskies get into condition for the coming season.

The desire and enthusiasm, shown by all team members in anticipation of their first meet with Howard University on January 6, is a good indication of their determination to break into the winning column. The diving team will be composed of returning lettermen Ron Lazarus along with Dan Rice and Hayden Jones. This trio is expected to give Bloomsburg opponents plenty of stiff competition while racking up points for the Huskies. In the butterfly event, Floyd Crimm sophomore letterman, and Harold Ackerman, a freshman with no previous experience, are expected to give Bloomsburg its strongest combination in this event in three years of competition. Three candidates are vying for the two starting berths in the breaststroke event including Tom Little, Ron Lazarus, a sophomore, and John Lewis, freshman. Nelson Swarts, a junior, and sophomores Don Watkins and Don Hopkins, are being counted on to cop their share of honors in the backstroke. The greatest allaround ability has been displayed by a contingent of eight candidates in the free-style event. Heading this group are Don Young and Lou Konetski, juniors and Chuck Jasper and Joe Welter, sophomores.

In spite of the newness of the sport and the relatively inexperience of most members of the squad, the Huskies have continued to schedule meets with other colleges where swimming has long been an established varsity sport. Of the 8 meets on the schedule, one might well predict that the Huskies could start their third season, with at least an even break in the win-loss department,

## ELI McLAUGHLIN - VARSITY COACH

Hardworking, affable Eli McLaughlin joined the Bloomsburg State College faculty and the Husky coaching staff in September, 1961. A 1957 graduate of West Chester State College, he was an outstanding center for three years on the Ram's squad and served one year as line coach for the freshman team. A veteran of military service, he was a Sergeant with the United States Air Force, and as Director of Special Services at Edwards Air Force Base in California, he organized, directed, and participated in the sports program.

While teaching at Penncrest High School, McLaughlin continued his participation in athletics, served four years as football line coach, three years as golf coach and two years as assistant wrestling coach. For more than eight years, he has worked as a swimming coach for private clubs, and has been a qualified swimming official for the same period of time. He gives much of the credit for his success in swimming to Charles Roeser, former Olympic Referee and Starter, who served as his mentor in gaining swimming knowledge. Many of the swimmers, coached by McLaughlin, have gone on to win recognition as top performers in the sport.

In addition to his duties as varsity swimming coach, McLaughlin serves as line coach for the Bloomsburg football squad.
