TEAM OUTLOOK

The hopes of continuing a winning tradition this season will depend primarily on two things: (1) the amount of dedication and desire to improve their best performances by the ten returning lettermen and (2) how quickly the freshmen prospects develop to give the balance and strength the team will need.

"Because of the very fact we have proven ourselves as a respectable team, previously scheduled opponents now have dropped us, and therefore we must be willing to accept new challenges," Coach McLaughlin commented. "We will have to develop an optimistic outlook toward our schedule. When you consider competition will be against such university powers as Villanova, West Virginia, and Temple, along with Monmouth College and Oneonta of New York, it is not whether you won or lost —BUT—who did you BEAT." Defending PC champions Clarion State, as well as Edinboro State, Towson State, and Glassboro State will also prove formidable obstacles for the BSC squad.

"It will be a monumental task to improve last year's 9-5 record or end up with an even record, but I'm not counting this group of men out," quipped Coach McLaughlin. "Having the opportunity to host the Pennsylvania Conference Championships in February, has put the spotlight on our team and I know the fellows are eager, enthusiastic, and willing to represent Bloomsburg State in our usual traditional way."

Most of the squad has been involved in an early conditioning program since September and have increased work-outs on a daily basis. The team is led by team-elect Captain Paul Richards, the only senior and an outstanding leader with versatile abilities. Juniors expected to contribute quite heavily are Pennsylvania Conference 500 yard freestyle champion Rich Kozicki, Bill Ewell, George King, and Tim Sopko. Returning sophomores are led by the PC champion Stu Marvin, who performs in both the 50 and 100 yard freestyle events, Doug Thran, Steve Packer, Woody Jones, and Ed Ortals.

Although diving was the Huskies' weakest area last year, it certainly will be expected to be much stronger with returning sophomore Rick Walter, and the fine group of freshmen prospects of Gary Havens, Pete Campagna, Chip Callahan, and Doug McCourt. Other freshmen prospects to vie for varsity competition will be Jim Balchunas, Keith Torok, John Clayton, Chris Harnett, John Appleton, Larry Kitson, Steve Amelang, Ken Coll, Steve Hunt, Jim Kelly, Bill Salmon, and Steve Zmroczeck.

McLaughlin received both his Bachelor of Science and Master of Education degrees from West Chester State College and has taken additional work towards his doctorate at West Virginia University. He is an associate professor in the Health and Physical Education Department and has developed the overall aquatic program at the college. McLaughlin also served as varsity football line coach for three years (1961-63) and has been associated in the past as a head coach and assistant coach of baseball.

His background both as a swimming coach and an official has been quite extensive. McLaughlin is married to the former Patricia Repash and they have two daughters, Beth, age 15, and Jane, age 11. The McLaughlins reside at 225 West Twelfth St., Bloomsburg, Pa.

PATRICK KIEHL—diving coach—former outstanding diver and team captain at Clarion State; 1970-71 Pennsylvania Conference diving champion and Pennsylvania-Ohio Conference champion. In 1971, Kiehl won the NAIA diving championship and was voted All-American. He was awarded his degree in Elementary Education from Clarion State in 1972. A master at developing divers into

champions over the past several years, he is in his first year of diving coach at BSC and his third year in the same capacity at Bucknell University.
