Outlook

Improvement is expected when the Husky golfers open the 1982 season.

The top seven performers return for the Huskies, under fifth year coach Bob Reeder. In addition, freshman Brian Phillips is expected to break into the starting lineup.

Junior Steve Schultz played most of last season with a nagging leg injury, but should return this year in top form. He will be joined by sophomore Rich Winkler, who had a fine freshman season including the squad's only sub-par round and Phillips in the battle for the top position.

Also back are seniors Joe Roeder and Eric McKee as well as junior Steve Lenhardt and sophomores Kevin Gehris and Bill McGinnis all of whom saw action in 1981.

Other challengers for starting spots include juniors Bob Emert, Pat Flanagan, and Mike Keech along with sophomore Greg Zahour.

A formidable schedule is ahead including tough matches with traditional rivals East Stroudsburg and West Chester as well as a trip to the Lock Haven Invitational. The slate leads up to the Pennsylvania Conference Tournament at Shippensburg on May 3 and 4.

Head Coach



ROBERT REEDER enters his fifth season as head coach of the Bloomsburg State College golf team. His teams have posted a record of 36 wins and 20 losses during his tenure including a fine 12-2 mark in 1979 which was the school's best since the 1968-69 season (10-1).

The 12 wins were the most ever in one season in the history of golf at BSC.

Reeder's experience is evident from his championship flight performances at Frosty Valley Country Club, the Huskies' home course.

Before joining the BSC faculty in 1968, Reeder spent a year teaching at Lehigh University. He previously taught at Grove City College and Western Kentucky University. He earned both his bachelor's and master's degree at Penn State University. In addition, the coach has earned a Master of Arts degree in anthropology from the University of Colorado.

Reeder is a member of the American Anthropology Association and the American Sociological Association.
