The Program

The men's swimming and diving program at Bloomsburg University is in the process of taking a new direction. New head coach Dave Rider brings with him a wealth of experience that includes 10 years as a successful high school coach. During his tenure at that level, he built an outstanding record of 179-65-3 and saw many of his athletes gain state, regional and national honors.

"I'm enthused about implementing my plans into the system at Bloomsburg. The people in the program right now help sell it, and they are really looking forward to the years ahead of us."

The 1986-87 team roster does not include a senior and has eight performers in their first or second years with the team. Lack of numbers has been the biggest obstacle facing the Huskies over the past few seasons, and Rider's immediate goal is to add a number of versatile swimmers and divers to enhance the overall team performance against a schedule that regularly includes approximately 12 dual meets, a few invitationals and the conference championships. Several individuals have also represented Bloomsburg at the N.C.A.A. Division II national championships in the past seasons.

Bloomsburg competes in the 14-member Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference, the nation's largest Division II conference. The men's swimming and diving program has enjoyed several good seasons, finishing among the conference's top four teams on 14 occasions in the 27 years since the sport was introduced at Bloomsburg in the 1959-60 season.

Rider is the sixth head coach of the sport at Bloomsburg, succeeding Mary Gardner, who directed the unit for one year before becoming the school's Associate Athletic Director. Gardner, who initiated the university's highly successful women's swimming and diving program and coached the squad for 12 years, remains as a member of the team's coaching staff this season.

Prior to Gardner taking over both the men's and women's teams in 1985-86, Eli McLaughlin was the head coach for 23 seasons from 1961-62 to 1984-85. Other coaches included Donald Heilman (1959-60), Bob Zeigler (1960-61) and Cecil Turberville (1969-70), who filled in for McLaughlin during a sabbatical leave.

The team is young and the future looks good for Bloomsburg, according to Rider. "We want to start moving back up in the conference standings next year, but our main aim is to return to the top echelon of teams within the very near future."

The Coaching Staff

Head Coach

Dave Rider, former head swimming and diving coach at Norwin (Pa.) High School for the past eight years, is in his first season as director of aquatics at Bloomsburg University.

Rider serves as head coach of the Huskies men's and women's swimming and diving programs as well as overseeing the daily operations of the university's two pool facilities.



In addition to his coaching duties, Rider is a member of the university's department of Health and Physical Education.

While at Norwin, he served as both men's and women's coach and established a combined dual meet record of 159-63-3. His 1982 women's squad captured the Pennsylvania Interscholastic Athletic Association (P.I.A.A.) state championship, and his men's unit was the P.I.A.A. runnerup in 1984. During Rider's tenure, 61 performers earned All-State honors and 16 competitors gained All-American status.

He also established the Norwin Aqua Club, which boasted several junior and senior national qualifiers and placed performers in the U.S. Olympic Trials. The club also holds some national records.

Previously, he taught in the North Allegheny (Pa.) School District, where he developed and administered the community's aquatic program. Rider was the school's men's swimming coach for two seasons, compiling a 20-2 mark, while handling 15 All-State and two All-American swimmers.

Rider received his bachelor's degree in Near Eastern archaeology from the University of Chicago in 1968. He was a member of the school's varsity swimming and water polo teams. His physical education certificate and masters were granted at Slippery Rock University.

Assistant Coach



Mary Gardner is serving as assistant coach for the men's and women's swimming and diving programs this season after 12 years as the women's head coach. Gardner assumed the duties as Bloomsburg's Associate Athletic Director this year and the added responsibilities forced her to step aside as coach. Her teams posted an overall record of 88-28 in dual meet action and finished as the conference runnerup six years in a row from 1981 to 1986. She coached 25 performers to multiple All-American honors as the Huskies' coach.

Diving Coach

James "Larry" Miller has been the Huskies' men's and women's diving coach for the past five seasons. Prior to joining the Bloomsburg staff, Miller served as the aquatic specialist at the Cocoa Avenue Plaza in Hershey, Pa., for 12 years. He recently served as chairman of the Middle Atlantic A.A.U. Diving Committee and president of the Central Penn and Capital Area Diving Leagues.



Graduate Assistant



Eric Slingerland, a four-year performer as a member of the Huskies' diving corps from 1976-80, returns this season as a graduate assistant in the program. He was a walk-on as a freshman, having never dove before enrolling at Bloomsburg and became a Pennsylvania Conference placewinner as a senior. For the past six years, he has been a divisional controller for Phillips Seafood Restaurants in Ocean City, Maryland.

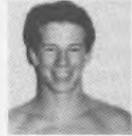
