Dedication



President's Message

In September 1954, there were 400 students enrolled at this college. As of fall 1959, there were 1147 enrolled. A quick look at these figures shows that in a five year period there has been a growth of student body of 287%. In the same five year period, Centennial Hall, the new dormitory, has been authorized, planned, and is due to be completed in June 1960. A new library has also been planned and construction has been started. The completion is due in April 1961. Construction on an addition to the campus school to house special education clinics and a kitchen and dining room which will seat at least 800 students will begin in the spring of 1960.

The college program has also been growing with the addition, in September 1959, of the master's degree

programs in the secondary field. Special education has also been added to the college program, and work will undoubtedly begin for teachers of the mentally retarded and in speech correction beginning either in the summer or fall of 1960.

In the years immediately ahead, the college, while expanding rapidly, is trying to keep in mind the one essential reason for its existence. The college exists to prepare better teachers for the children of this state, and the program of the college is geared to that goal. With students, faculty, and alumni working together, that goal becomes a reasonable purpose and we certainly hope that the children of Pennsylvania will greatly benefit from our endeavor.

Freshmen

One of the best ways to measure the growth of a college, and specifically this one, is to take a look at its freshman class. This class, with about 402 students, has been the largest freshman class to enroll at Edinboro. During the first three weeks, the freshmen became acquainted with the upperclassmen through Kangaroo Court and various other activities. 
Kiltie Fins




Football







Basketball




