






Administration

the sale of programs at the home football games are the club's fund raising projects. The Sweetheart Dance and selection of a Sweetheart highlighted the year's activities.









fully completed their task for the "Big Red" of S.S.T.C. by ending the 1956 campaign with six victories and only two defeats.



The Junior Varsity forecasted a bright future by ripping through their first nine games without a loss. This year's squad was coached by Jerry Fetrow.







Wrestling


An enthusiastic squad numbering thirty-five men promises well for the successful renewal of the sport of wrestling at S.S.T.C., after a lapse of seven years.




Men's Intramurals






As of now there is only one active co-ed intramural sport—archery. Recently plans were made for co-ed tennis, swimming and golf teams to supplement this program.




The programs are based on a two-level


scale. The varied programs are scheduled during the day and the more formal programs are obtained for the evening entertainment






