

It is also an exciting time as President Pogue continues to lead Edinboro University.



# Life is Just a Bowl of Chocolate



Life is sweet for Rick Gates. The 1980 graduate of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania is the recently appointed director of marketing for chocolate new products at Hershey Foods in Hershey, Pennsylvania. The father of three boys loves his work almost as much as he loves his family. The way he looks at his job, if you can't have fun working for a candy company, where can you have fun?

Gates heads up the division responsible for creating and marketing new chocolate products for Hershey. One recent example is Bites, the bite-sized candy that comes in four varieties. "We develop products from the initial concept through actual plant production. It's a blast!" said Gates. "We identify unmet consumer needs, and usage occasions and develop products that fit. My responsibility is the chocolate segment."

Gates has many, many connections to Edinboro – both the town and the University. His wife, Nancy (Needham) Gates, is a 1981 graduate of Edinboro. His father was the late Dr. Robert Gates, who worked at Edinboro for 20 years as director of research, vice president for support services, and as the school's transition and development officer. Three of Rick's siblings – David, Barbara and Jerry – also graduated from Edinboro, and his mother still lives in Edinboro.

After his father passed away on October 28, 1998, the family established the Dr. Robert D. Gates Scholarship Fund at Edinboro to help students with disabilities and special needs. "His life's work was focused on helping individuals with special needs," said Gates. The fact that Edinboro is nationally ranked as a handicapped accessible campus is a tribute to my father and his vision of what the university should be.

"The Edinboro Foundation, which was responsible for acquiring grants for the campus, worked out of our basement for several years. It was a part of all of our lives."


Through his ground-breaking work in establishing Edinboro's program for people with disabilities, the elder Gates touched a lot of people's lives. His family hopes the scholarship fund will continue to allow that to happen forever.

Rick's career began as early as 13 when he started washing dishes and waiting tables at the former Sheraton/Holiday Inn. He majored in

communications at Edinboro, and during the first semester of his senior year he interned with Tal Advertising in Erie. Tal liked his work

and hired him before he graduated. So, during the second semester of his senior year he worked full time by day at Tal and finished school at night.

Among Tal's clients was Hershey Foods. As an account executive, Gates went to Hershey twice a month and eventually was sent to Harrisburg to establish an office to service Tal's accounts in central Pennsylvania. Another account was Weaver Chicken, which was headquartered in nearby New Holland. Weaver hired Gates to



work in new products and expansion. "Weaver was a regional company expanding nationally," said Gates. "My job was to set up sales networks and develop marketing programs for the introduction of the Weaver company to consumers west of the Mississippi."

Hershey asked Gates to join the company in 1985 where he started as a brands manager for special markets, which included such premium chocolates as Golden Almond and Golden Almond Nuggets. In 1988 he was promoted to new products manager for grocery marketing where his teams launched the chocolate drink box and Chocolate Shoppe toppings.



In 1990 he accepted a position as a regional marketing manager in the international division where he spent most of his time in Korea and Japan. Two years later he was made director of marketing for all international operations. The job took him to such locales as Germany, Italy, Dubai and Asia. In May of 1995 he was promoted to general manager of Asia

Pacific, where he was

in charge of all of

the Pacific Rim.

But after six years of travel, Gates decided it was time to depart international in order to spend more time with his wife and their sons Robert, Daniel and David. "There's nothing more important than your family. You work hard to make enough to provide for your family, and if you're not careful you turn around and they're gone. We have three sons and we want to enjoy them as much as we possibly can as they grow up. We are very fortunate. Our family loves central Pennsylvania, and I love making new chocolate products for Hershey's. It's a very good fit for us."

As a marketing director, Gates works with a highly creative, multidisciplinary team of people who get together and decide "how to turn concepts into reality"

- 1903 South Hall was used as a quarantine infirmary, and Haven Hall was built. The Ford Motor Company was established, and the Wright Brothers took flight.

Gates describes the product development process as a funnel. Hundreds of product concepts are fed into the top of funnel where they are screened out layer by layer. If a team is working at the start of the funnel, they may have 100 different product concepts at once. At the next level only 30 ideas may have survived. At the bottom of the funnel, only 3 or 4 may be viable products. At that point the team becomes deeply involved with each product – designing packaging, developing manufacturing facilities, creating finished product specifications, and developing the marketing plan.

Gates said the new product confectionery business is extremely competitive. You have to develop product concepts that have a clear reason for being with consumers, and your product needs to meet and/or exceed consumers' expectations.

"In the candy business that means the product has to taste great."

The early years of Milton Hershey instilled in him the value of hard work.

He was born on September 13, 1857, in a farmhouse near the Central Pennsylvania village of Derry Church. He was a descendant of people who had come to Pennsylvania from Switzerland and Germany in the 1700s. Raised as a Mennonite, he attended school only through the fourth grade before his father, Henry Hershey, put him to work as a printer's apprentice in Gap, Pa.

When it became apparent his talents did not lie in printing, he went on to become an apprentice to a Lancaster, Pa., candy-maker and, in 1876 at the age of 18, opened his own candy shop in Philadelphia. The business failed after six years.

The next stop was Denver, Colorado, where he accepted a job with a local caramel manufacturer. There, he learned that superior results could be achieved when fresh milk was used in the caramel-making process.

Hershey moved on to Chicago in 1883, then to New Orleans and later to New York City -- attempting to establish his own candy business in each location. He returned to Lancaster, Pa., in 1886, where, after raising the necessary capital, he began the business which established his reputation as a candy-maker -- the Lancaster Caramel Company.

Hershey became fascinated with German chocolate-making machinery on exhibit at the Chicago International Exposition in 1893. He bought the equipment for his Lancaster plant and soon began producing his own chocolate coatings for caramels. In early 1894, the Hershey Chocolate Company was born as a subsidiary of his Lancaster caramel business. In addition to chocolate coatings, Hershey made breakfast cocoa, sweet chocolate and baking chocolate.

In 1900, Hershey sold the Lancaster Caramel Company for \$1 million. However, he retained the chocolate manufacturing equipment and the rights to manufacture chocolate, believing a large market existed for affordable confections that could be mass produced. He returned to his birthplace, Derry Church, and located his chocolate manufacturing operation in the heart of Pennsylvania's dairy country, where he could obtain large supplies of fresh milk. In 1903, with the money he received for his caramel business, he began to build what is now the world's largest chocolate manufacturing plant.

# TEACHER ASSIGNED TO FIND "EXTRA" FUNDING FOR SPECIAL PROJECTS

Ruth Ruud ('83) isn't sure how much grant money she's received in her two decades of teaching, but she estimates it's more than \$50,000.

In the next year, she'll be looking for 15 times that amount in her new job as coordinator of grants and special projects for the Millcreek Township School District.

"I've always set my sights high," said the award-winning educator who is currently a candidate for Pennsylvania Teacher of the Year and has a goal of finding \$750,000 in new grants. "It is a target and we're hoping I can reach it."

Ruud decided to apply for the new position, which the school board created in June, because of her interest in grants.

Through the years, she said, she's been fortunate to get grants to fund different programs for her students.

"It has supported really a lot of neat learning experiences for my students," she said.

It was a \$1,000 grant from International Paper that helped create the waterfall at Walnut Creek Middle School where Ruud was a sixth-grade science teacher until taking the new job.

Now, proceeds from the school's recycling program, which also was started with grants, help with upkeep of the waterfall biome and its goldfish; lizards and turtles.

Super Science Saturday, another of Ruud's top projects at Walnut Creek, also has been

supported by grants. Former principal Ken Borland, ('76 and '78) who is now the district's supervisor of personnel and improvement, said the annual day is one of Walnut Creek's showcase events. It attracts about 230 students a year who get to spend the day learning about science and doing hands-on activities.

Ruud does a lot of her project thinking and planning while walking along Presque Isle Bay.

"I would get an idea and then I would try to find a funding source for the idea," Ruud said in explaining her search for grants. And no grant amount is too small for Ruud, who's sought awards of varying amounts and said it all helps when it goes together.

"I'll go for 500 (dollars)," she said. "If you get one for 500 (dollars), you're as excited as one for 20 hundred (dollars)."

Ruud said she has lots of experiences she can share with teachers and in her new job hopes to reach even more students than she did as a teacher.

"I am going to miss the contact," she said about leaving the classroom. "To be with the kids is very special to me."

But she looks at her new position as a way to make opportunities available for more students.

Grants and projects are one way to make students excited about learning, Ruud explained.

Borland said Ruud motivated students through her grant-funded projects.

"These kids got fired up about it," he said. He specifically mentioned the WATTchers energy conservation group Ruud worked with at Walnut Creek.

Teachers also will benefit from Ruud's experience, he added. In her new position, she said, she can help teachers work through their ideas and get projects going.

"Monies are there," she said.

As she discovers what grants exist, Ruud said she'll forward them to teachers.

Then the real work will begin, Ruud said.

"It takes so many hours to write a grant," she explained, rattling off the

phone calls, searches for consultants and time spent looking up prices.

But Ruud already has a plan to entice teachers and motivate them to seek out grants. She calls it "Dream a Dream." Ruud said she wants teachers to tell her what they dream of doing for or with their students. Then she'll help teachers look for grants to fulfill their dreams.

Once teachers get grants, Ruud also will be there to help them implement the projects. And for those who don't succeed at grant attempts, Ruud will be there to help with the follow-up to see why they didn't get an award and what revisions need to be made for another attempt.

"I have a lot of goals for this year," she said.

But one stands first.

"My top goal is to make a difference in the lives of students in the Millcreek Township School District," she said.

While Ruud is off helping all the district's students, her programs for children at Walnut Creek won't end.

"Things are gonna continue, but things are gonna change," Borland said, adding that the school is dedicated to providing science education.

"I'm going to miss working with Ruth," he said.

"You just don't replace a person like that."

Earlier this year, Edinboro graduate Ruth Ruud was nominated for the Pennsylvania Department of Education's Teacher-of-the-Year award. The former sixth grade science teacher at Walnut Creek Middle School in the Millcreek School District is now the coordinator of grants and special projects for the district.

Ruud taught at Walnut Creek for seven years and in the Millcreek School District for a total of 19 years.

She has been recognized numerous times for her dedication to the teaching of science and has received the Presidential Award for Excellence in Science and Mathematics Teaching. As one of the 12 finalists from across the state for the Teacher of the Year honors, Ruud received a crystal apple and a certificate. She will also be able to participate in the annual Pennsylvania Teacher Forum.

Had she won the award, she would have represented Pennsylvania at the national Teacher of the Year competition in Washington, D.C. in 2000.

"All my friends thought I was crazy," said the grandmother and retired Edinboro professor. "One even asked me, 'Have you looked at your birth certificate recently?""

Undeterred, Polley spent her birthday and 55 other days between Easter Sunday and Memorial Day pedaling a 24-speed Cannondale across the southern United States. She rode about 2,700 miles, from just south of Los Angeles to St. Augustine, Florida.

"It was a very civilized trip, really," she explained. "We stayed in bed and breakfasts or hotels every night, a van carried our gear, and I spent night after night climbing into a hot tub . . . That I'd say, is a far cry from those people who camp on the roadsides and shower at campgrounds."

Polley said that while she and her 18 over-50 companions were well looked after on the tour, the ride wasn't without challenges.

"Living in Florida, there aren't many hills (to train on)," she said. "It took some getting used to riding up and down the mountains out West."

In fact, she said, she was most afraid during a 10-mile "screaming descent" on a winding mountain road in southern California.

"I was terrified of crashing," she explained.

After all, only two months before she had broken her collarbone in a fall from the bike while training.

"I knew it wasn't quite healed yet and didn't want to break it again," she said.

Then came the climbs in Apache Junction, Safford and Needle's Eye in Arizona; the harsh headwinds and hail in Texas; and the high humidity of Louisiana, Mississippi, Alabama, and Florida.

"Texas was the toughest," she said. "We spent 13 days just crossing Texas."

She explained that many days in the Lone Star State were spent going north or south to find

non-interstate roads on which they could ride.

"No matter what direction we were going it seemed like we were headed into the wind. It was tiring," she said. Polley and her companions rode 35 to 95 miles a day, depending on the terrain and weather.

"It's odd," she said. "But I never saw myself as a cyclist and now I've done this."

Polley, who taught elementary education at Edinboro, didn't begin cycling avidly until her retirement 11 years ago. She joined a seniors cycling club after she and her husband, Bob, moved to a town near Fort Myers, Fla.

"We rode only a few miles a week," she said. "It was nothing like this." It was an email from a friend a year ago that started her on the road to her first cross-country tour.

"He suggested it and I thought, 'Well, why not?" Her friends and family – with the exception of her husband – were incredulous. "No one thought I should do it. But my husband, he was very supportive."

Polley added that she'll probably not do another ride like this. "But I think I'll do some of those two- and three-day trips or maybe even one of those European bike tours along the Danube," she said. "For the moment, I'm just relaxing and enjoying my new great-grandchild."

She trained for about a year to prepare, and finished the ride without a problem or injury. She even earned special honors for being the only rider in the group to cross the continent without getting a flat tire.

"I wouldn't say it was easy, and I certainly feel proud of what I accomplished," she said.

# FORMER GOVERNOR VISITS CAMPUS

Homecoming Weekend proved to be very exciting for many alumni and friends of Edinboro University. The festivities on Friday, October 8, included the visit of former Governor George M. Leader to the campus for the rededication of Leader Clinic. Renamed the Governor George Leader Speech and Hearing Center, the facility was first named for Leader in 1961.

"There were two things we thought very few people here on campus recognized about the building," said Dr. Roy Shinn, director of the speech-language pathology graduate program. "We, first off, wanted to let people know what the 'Leader' stood for.

"Secondly, the word clinic is just not the term that is often used at places like this," said Shinn. "Many students have often mislabeled Leader Clinic as being just another health center on campus. With the name change, people will be well aware of what the building is used for.

"Now when students, parents, patients, and faculty walk into the building, they'll see a wooden plaque with a picture and a quote honoring Governor Leader," Shinn said.

The quote on the plaque reads: "Every child, no matter what their talents or disability, deserves an education that will permit them to achieve the zenith of their potential."

During his tenure as governor from 1955 to 1959 and for many years since his term of office, one of Governor Leader's many initiatives has been to address the needs of children with disabilities.

Because of the successful speech-language hearing disorders program started during the early 1950s, Leader Clinic was established to further accommodate the needs of testing speech and hearing defects, personality disorders, etc. Over the years, hundreds of Edinboro graduates have successfully completed this program.

In 1974, responding to the need for graduates to continue their studies on the master's level, the speech-language pathology graduate program was initiated and has since received accreditation by the Council on Academic Accreditation in

Audiology and Speech-Language Pathology. Since then, more than 250 students have earned their master's degrees and gone on to successful professional careers in hospitals, schools, rehabilitation centers, agencies, universities and private practices around the country.

Each year, approximately 150 outstanding students from throughout the world apply to this competitive two-year program, and only 20 are selected. Upon graduation, students must pass a national examination in speech-language pathology in order to become licensed and nationally certified. Edinboro University graduates have been rated above the national average for certification.

Two graduates of the program who received recognition during the ceremony were Andrea Novak ('95) and Patricia Schaal ('78). Both were awarded the University's first "Alumni on the Move" award. Initiated by President Pogue last year, the award program provides an opportunity for the University to recognize alumni who are making great strides or realizing major accomplishments in their careers and/or personal lives.

Another initiative associated with the speech and communication studies department is the establishment of the **Governor George Leader Scholarship**. Proceeds from the annual Speech-Language and Hearing conferences have been used to fund this scholarship program, along with donations from alumni, friends, grants, auctions, and other fund-raising events.

During the rededication ceremony, Leader praised the many individuals who have educated students and the students themselves who, in turn, educate others and provide much-needed services for our citizens.

Leader stressed the importance of continuing to strive for more excellence in our life's work. He emphasized the value of working with individuals in all capacities of life, that we should never consider a job complete, and we should continue to make the project or program

better. He stressed the significance of *giving* to our community, helping those individuals less fortunate who desperately need support – not only financially, but also spiritually.

Through his deep religious beliefs, Governor Leader has dedicated his life to the causes of education, special education, people with disabilities and many societal needs. He continues to interact and work with people from all walks of life every day and hopes to do so for many more years to come.

#### **Bruce Whitehair Named Vice President**

Since 1995, Whitehair has been vice president and manager of public relations for PNC Bank in Erie, where he was responsible for image advertising, press relations, employee communications and special events for PNC Bank's Northwest Market, as well as administering the PNC Bank Foundation's philanthropic program of charitable contributions.

Prior to PNC, Whitehair served for 17 years as manager of corporate communications for the

Lord Corporation in Erie, where his responsibilities included worldwide corporate and product promotions, marketing and employee communications, video production, and printing and tradeshow exhibitions.

While at Lord, he received numerous design and advertising awards, including "Best Ad" in 1983 from BUSINESS MARKETING. In 1990, the Erie Ad Club named him Ad Person of the Year.

Whitehair graduated from Edinboro University in 1973 with an education degree in English. Prior to joining Lord in 1977, he taught English and communications in the Millcreek School District. He was also a radio announcer for stations in Ashtabula, Conneaut and McKean, and attended graduate schools at Kent State, Penn State and Gannon universities. While a student at Edinboro, he also managed the campus radio station.

On accepting his new position, Whitehair said he believes that Edinboro is poised for dramatic growth and transformation.

"What impresses me the most is the renewed energy, optimism, enthusiasm and purpose I see under President Pogue's leadership," Whitehair said. "I've maintained a strong emotional bonding with Edinboro, and I am privileged now to be able to give something back to the institution that provided the solid foundation in my professional development."

## New Master's of Social Work Degree Announced

A new Master's of Social Work degree program has been approved by the State System of Higher Education. Dr. Donna Hixon, a professor of social work, said there is a critical, long-standing need for a graduate social work program in northwestern Pennsylvania.

A master's degree is especially important for social workers because it is a professionally recognized degree, and it makes them eligible for licensure in Pennsylvania. Hixon said many area employers prefer a master's degree, but have hired people with other degrees because the master's degrees were not available.

The new program will teach what is known as general social practice, but it will also offer concentrations in administration and direct practice, which is working with individuals, families or groups.

To head up the new program, Edinboro has hired Dr. Emelicia Mizio, currently the chair of the social work department at the University of Indiana at Terra Haute. She will join the Edinboro faculty in January, and the first course will be taught in the fall of 2000.

The University is creating 16 new courses for the 60-credit program. Most students will fulfill those credits through two academic years and a summer if they attend full time. Students with a bachelor's degree in social work may need only 45 graduate credits to earn the master's degree.



Students Build Ceramic Kiln

For several weeks this summer, a handful of art students toiled under the sun, learning how to build a kiln by actually building one. The class was called ceramic kiln construction, which is taught every other year by professor Lee Rexrode. Not only did they build something they will be able to use in the future as ceramic artists, they also learned some valuable construction skills such as masonry and welding. "They created the tools to fire their own works," said Rexrode.

The kiln became a labor of love for the six graduate and undergraduate students. Although the class officially ended at 11:20 a.m. every day, Rexrode and the students regularly worked well into the afternoon and on weekends. Even after the summer session ended, some of the students returned to finish the project.

The students learned to lay block, mix mortar, cut steel and weld. The course is not required for ceramics majors, but the students thought those who didn't take it would miss out on an opportunity to learn about their craft at its core.

This kiln required thousands of pounds of castable material – valued around one dollar a pound – which were donated by the Thermal Ceramics Company of Crafton. Edinboro acquired the material about three years ago when Latrobe Steel decided it didn't need it. With the help of Norm Willow of Thermal Ceramics, Edinboro received 28,000 lbs. of material called Kaocrete 250. Edinboro was able to store the material in the barn of Cambridge Springs potter Bill Campbell. This kiln used about half of the coarse powder, leaving enough for another kiln someday.

BNZ Company of Zelienople, Pa. donated the soft brick which was used for the kiln door.

# **Community Counseling Program Announced**

In the face of a critical need for qualified community counselors, Edinboro University has announced a new Master of Arts degree track in community counseling. It will offer three areas of specialization: drug and alcohol counseling, gerontological counseling, and family counseling.

Dr. Salene Cowher, who chairs Edinboro's counseling and human development department, said the demand for highly qualified counselors is growing – particularly within social service agencies. The most valuable part of the Edinboro program is that its graduates will be eligible for the Pennsylvania counselor's license.

Earlier this year, the Council for Accreditation of Counseling and Related Educational Programs (CACREP) approved Edinboro's counseling tracks in student personnel services (college counseling and practice) and school counseling (elementary and secondary) for seven years, the longest period of accreditation awarded by CACREP. Cowher said she expects the community counseling track will also become accredited by CACREP, perhaps within 18 months.

"Being accredited is really an exclusive recognition of your program," said Cowher. "There is only one other school in Pennsylvania with the CACREP accreditation in student personnel services that we have, and only 10 others nationally."

# **President Pogue Heads Erie Millenium Commission**

At the invitation of City of Erie Mayor Joyce Savocchio and Erie County Executive Judy Lynch, President Frank Pogue accepted chairmanship of the 21-member Millennium Commission charged with overseeing Erie's countywide celebration of the new century.

Pogue said he sees Erie County's initiative as a celebration of community – past, present and future – with a central focus of inspiring and encouraging community involvement in improving the quality of community life. The theme, *Together 2000*, reflects this community spirit through unity, confidence and pride, and calls for citizen partnerships to build better communities and a better future.

"The millennium celebration provides opportunities to renew our commitment to bringing communities together around a significant number of special events designed to enhance civility," Pogue said, "and the goal of Together 2000 is to bring all of Erie County together around celebrations that reinforce the ideals of civility, including fairness, tolerance, collegiality and civic responsibility. . .the same ideals as those inspired in our own University's Century of Civility celebration."

The Commission will be developing a millennium calendar, and will also be inviting all community agencies, corporations and businesses, educational institutions, health facilities, religious groups and others to incorporate the *Together 2000* theme in their planned activities.

The Millennium Commission will also seek project submissions from organizations, communities and neighborhoods throughout Erie County to designate as *Together 2000* initiatives. These can be existing projects, such as the lighting of the Erie Land Lighthouse beacon, or new projects. Activity submissions may join with existing events, such as We Love Erie Days, or suggested new events.

Other plans to celebrate the millennium county-wide include speakers' forums, community dialogues on a variety of topics, civility campaigns, and programs to promote volunteerism among youth.

These initiatives and Edinboro's own Century of Civility will provide the Edinboro Family and regional citizens with many opportunities to celebrate the arrival of the year 2000 with resolve to make a more peaceful, collegial and prosperous century for all people.

A ribbon-cutting ceremony was recently held for the newly renovated courtyard and reflective garden at the Miller Research Learning Center. The replanted courtvard was redesigned by the Eagle Scout project of Matthew Beckman, a sophomore at General McLane High School. With the assistance of his father, education professor Donald Beckman, Matt built raised flowerbeds, benches, a hexagon planter with seating, a recirculating waterfall, and two standing science centers.





# Q&A

### WHAT IS THE ANNUAL FUND?

The Annual Fund is a campaign that provides Edinboro Family members with the opportunity to support Edinboro University in a variety of ways.

Resources generated through the Annual Fund enhance our student's educational experiences.

# WHY IS GIVING TO THE ANNUAL FUND IMPORTANT?

As state appropriations account for a decreasing portion of our annual budget, Edinboro University must increasingly rely on externally generated revenue. The future growth of the University will be determined largely by its ability to accumulate increasing private support. The Annual Fund is important not only as a source of revenue; it sends a message, too. Many potential corporate donors, for example, will determine their level of support based, in part, on that which is garnered from the University's base of closest supporters, primarily alumni and employees. Participation also inspires increased ownership and a sense of belonging. One's participation in the Annual Fund is a way to exhibit support for each other as members of the Edinboro Family. But the most important reasons for giving are the students who benefit from enhanced scholarship support, educational programs and student services.

# WHAT GIVING OPTIONS DOES A DONOR ENJOY?

Each year, the University and the Alumni Association select a joint initiative as a focus for the fund-raising efforts. This year's goal is to raise money for honors scholarships. Directing one's gift to this initiative will assist the University in attaining the goal. Of course, there are other needs as well. A donor may designate his or her gift toward a scholarship, academic programs, or another area that holds special meaning. Still others choose to provide an unrestricted gift, allowing the University or the Alumni Association to direct the funds where the need is the greatest.



# Brian Duffy ('86) Hits the Big Time as Cleveland Television Announcer

"Aggressive, arrogant, and maybe even cocky." With these words, Mike Gallagher described Brian Duffy as the two took part in a speech class at Edinboro University. Now the veteran sportscaster might describe his closest friend as competitive, talented and knowledgeable.

The two formed a broadcasting trio along with John Evans ('82) at WJET-TV in Erie, an ABC affiliate, which stood the test of time for more than ten years. It began to fall apart when Evans moved to the news department last year, then it dissolved completely when Duffy moved on to Cleveland as a sportscaster at WUAB-TV and WOIO-TV. What made it most remarkable was that all three attended Edinboro. Throw in Mike Ruzzi ('83), the sports anchor at WICU-TV (NBC) in Erie, and Edinboro University communications students dominated the sports airwaves.

Gallagher laughs when he looks back on his initial incident with Duffy, but his counterpart was hardly in a laughing mood when he heard of Gallagher's remarks. "We met in a speech class," recalls Gallagher. "I was a sophomore, and Brian was a freshman. The professor asked us to anonymously give three impressions of an assigned individual in the classroom, and I had to describe Brian. I said he was 'cocky, arrogant and aggressive.' When Duffy heard the description, he stood up and wanted to know who said that. He wanted to beat me up!. We turned out to be roommates and best friends."

Duffy came to Edinboro as one of those socalled "sports stars." A standout in both football and basketball at Cleveland's St. Joseph High School, Duffy envisioned himself playing football in college, but knee problems curtailed those ambitions.

# **ATHLETICS**

"I was actually recruited more as a football player," Duffy recalled. "But I had some setbacks with my knees. I got some advice from doctors to play basketball. All the PSAC schools had been recruiting me for basketball, and Guy Conti [then head basketball coach] had been recruiting me for Edinboro all along."

The knee problems ultimately got the best of Duffy. Renowned for his outside shot and athleticism, the 6'4" swingman was close to earning a starting spot as a freshman. Just days before the start of the season, however, he suffered a knee injury. In a cast for four months, Duffy would return in time to play in four games and score six points.

He appeared in 19 games the following season, averaging 3.2 points. His moment of glory may well have come in a game in his own backyard of Cleveland, as the Fighting Scots played at Akron. While losing, 89-60, Duffy dropped in 12 markers.

Duffy became a key ingredient in Edinboro's NCAA playoff run in 1985-86. The Scots finished 18-13 and advanced to the Division II playoffs before losing to Millersville. Duffy averaged 3.8 points while playing just under 14 minutes a game.

"When I look back on it now, I'm proud of what I did," said Duffy. "Back then I was disappointed. I completely blew my knee out my freshman year. In my last season I was a captain and played in the NCAA Playoffs. I always wondered what I could have accomplished, though."

"We met in a speech class," recalls Gallagher. "I was a sophomore, and Brian was a freshman. The professor asked us to anonymously give three impressions of an assigned individual in the classroom, and I had to describe Brian.

While his playing career took a turn for the worse, Duffy's academic career took a turn in a promising direction, though one he did not expect. "I took a radio class," he recalled. "I didn't take any broadcasting classes. I was interested in advertising and public relations."

Through Gallagher's urging, Duffy began doing color commentary on basketball radio broadcasts. "When he hurt his knee. I convinced him to do color for me," Gallagher remembers. "We did the Edinboro-Robert Morris game. We continued to do games together, and did so well, we ended up doing the Strong Vincent High School game the year they won the state championship."

Duffy graduated with a bachelor's degree in communications in December 1986. That's when his journey into television broadcasting began.

"During Duffy's last year of school, I was working at JET," said Gallagher. "I helped him get an internship at the station. Within three days after he completed his internship he was hired. Within two years he was the weekend anchor, and within five years he became the main sports figure," Gallagher pointed out.

With Gallagher at his side, he would go on to co-host the popular Sunday Sports Extra following the 11:00 p.m. news. It was a forum to highlight the previous week's local sports stories. The show evolved from a live in-studio production to live at Damon's Restaurant in Erie. For area high school and college athletics, it was the ultimate in exposure.

Oddly enough, it was Gallagher who heard the bright lights calling and had dreams of a network job. The

sportscasting field was a way for Duffy to stay close to his true love - sports.
"I wasn't sure what I wanted to do,"
Duffy admitted. "I had an opportunity to do a couple internships with the Millcreek School District. Mike was at JET and he talked me into it (an internship). I figured I could stay involved in sports. I got to love going to Gannon, Mercyhurst and of course, Edinboro. I didn't know much about television, but I figured it was a great way to stay involved in sports.

"For the first two or three years I did it with the intention of making a lot of contacts. I figured I would meet the right people. It wasn't until I did the Gannon basketball games from Springfield in 1990 that I really became interested. We did the Gannon games back to Erie, but they also televised all the other games, and I did them all. That's when I fell in love with it," Duffy said.

Now almost ten years later, Duffy is working in a major television market with endless possibilities, and Gallagher is still in Erie. His career suffered a cruel twist when he was run over by a Houston Oiler at a Cleveland Browns game in 1989 while filming on the sideline. Countless surgeries have followed to repair the damage to his jaw, not to mention several lawsuits. The big time no longer waits, but he is now back on a nightly basis as the sports anchor at WJET, and renowned for his production capabilities. His best buddy, meanwhile, is working in a Cleveland market that stands 12th nationally, and dealing with some of the top professional athletes on a dayto-day basis.

Duffy is convinced that it could well be Gallagher, and not him, in the major market if not for the injury. He also realizes the crucial role his friend has played in his development. "If Mike hadn't gotten hurt in Cleveland, he would be where he wants to be, including the major market," stressed Duffy. "He is still the most talented person I've worked with. Mike produced my tapes for Cleveland."

Now Duffy can be seen interviewing the Indians' Jim Thome or star rookie Tim Couch of the Cleveland Browns. As Gallagher puts it, he "fits into the Cleveland sports fan mentality." While Pittsburgh bred through and through, Gallagher says it with envy.

"The athletes in Cleveland are finding that he establishes relationships," pointed out Gallagher. "He has their trust."

So much so that Duffy was hired as an NFL correspondent by KCBS in Los Angeles. The Sunday morning radio show is hosted by former NFL player Jim Hill, and airs throughout the country. His smooth delivery and impeccable knowledge of sports puts him on the fast track to places like Los Angeles, New York and Washington. Gallagher says Duffy "fits the mold." "He has the look," said Gallagher.

Yet Duffy still can't get his
Edinboro roots out of his system. "I
feel like I've left home," he related. "I
have family in Cleveland. But I miss
the area. I miss being involved with
Edinboro. I miss the day-to-day
things. I knew all the coaches and had
good relationships. You don't get that
kind of personal satisfaction (here)."

With that said, Duffy is smart enough to realize that he is a hot commodity, and in the world of television, fame can be fleeting. "My focus has changed," admitted Duffy. "The job with KCBS can open up a ton of doors. Obviously at some point I

would like to work with one of the networks. It is something that I can see myself pursuing within the next couple years."

If the truth were known, Duffy turned the Cleveland job down three times, according to Gallagher. With Gallagher's prodding, he finally relented, moving his wife, Donna, and three children - Ryan (5), Colin (3) and Elizabeth (1) - back to his hometown.

Fear of failure? No. Reality? Yes. Duffy openly admits he didn't want to become a TV gypsy, bouncing from one similar market to another looking for that one chance to hit it big.

"I didn't want to uproot my family," noted Duffy. "My wife [the former Donna Esposito ('86), who also played basketball at Edinboro] has sacrificed tremendously. She had a lot of career ambitions. She was a computer science major and a good athlete. She has given up a lot for my sake."

In the competitive world of network television, despite having "the looks" and "what it takes," Duffy could well fall short of his appointed goal. And that wouldn't be all bad as far as he's concerned. "For me, it all started in Erie and Edinboro," he beamed.

As for Gallagher, it's easy to sense the pride in his best friend's accomplishments. He even named one of his children after Duffy. And there is no envy that Duffy is living Gallagher's dream.

"Edinboro is special because of Brian Duffy," said Gallagher. "He and I fought to get out, now he would love to come back. I grew up with Dan Marino. In my eyes, he's a Dan Marino. Everything he does, he has to be the best at. He insists on being the best and being first."

Duffy shrugs off such praise and feels he was at the right place at the right time. With a lot of talent and a little luck, Brian Duffy is on the fast track to television stardom. But he hasn't forgotten his Edinboro roots or friends with shaky opinions of him in a long ago speech class.

# **Bryant Houston Dies Tragically**

Tragedy hit the Edinboro
University Family in late August when
assistant men's basketball coach Bryant
Houston was killed in an automobile
accident. Houston had been hired only
eight days earlier to replace Brian
Cupps, who had departed in May to
take a similar position at Stetson
University.

The mishap occurred on August 24 as he was driving on Route 6N heading home to Cleveland. Houston had joined Greg Walcavich's staff after serving as the head coach at Cuyahoga Community College for five years. He had guided the Challengers to a 68-43 record including a 24-5 finish in 1995-96. CCC won the Ohio Community College Athletic Conference championship that year, only to lose in the NJCAA Region XII finals by a basket.

Houston's hiring was the culmination of a long search by Walcavich. He was stunned to learn of the accident after working with his new assistant for just a week. "Bryant was as excited about being at Edinboro as I am," Walcavich told Erie Morning News writer Jim Camp following the

accident. "In this kind of work, I don't feel you can do a terrific job unless you're happy where you are. He was here only eight days, but he was obviously thrilled to be here."

Walcavich felt that in his short time as a staff member, Houston had made an impression. "Bryant was really special with his ability to communicate, especially with young people. He was great at connecting with people, and I was really looking forward to having him be a part of our basketball team."

At Cuyahoga Community College, Houston was described as a person with courage and self-determination.

He devoted most of his life to basketball, beginning as a prepster at John Hay High School in Cleveland. He played at Cuyahoga for two years before playing his last two seasons at Wheeling College. During his senior year at Wheeling, Houston was renowned for his three-point shooting, leading all divisions in three-pointers.

He signed as a free agent with the New York Knicks, surviving until the final cut. He also tried out with the Los Angeles Lakers. Then came his coaching career, which began with a stint in the Cleveland Public Schools, followed by a stop at Dyke College.

The 42-year-old left behind two daughters, Lynette and Bryanna.
