IT'S MORE THAN A PHONATHON IT'S MAKING CONNECTIONS



Past generations of graduates connect with students to help build a strong foundation for future generations

In the Alumni House lies a room that comes alive in the evenings and Sunday afternoons with the energy of students. They meet during the fall and spring semesters to call alumni, parents and friends across the United States. This group of Edinboro students has taken on a task that is very important to the University, its alumni and the community by securing gifts from their callers to benefit current and future students at Edinboro University. The students value the quality education they are receiving at Edinboro and realize the life-long advantage it provides.

Each year student callers solicit contributions for the Alumni Annual Fund. This Alumni Phonathon raises money for operations, student programs, student activities, athletics, student services, programming and scholarships.

As representatives of the University, the students talk to more than 750 alumni each week sharing experiences and updating them on activities and events occurring on campus. Their goal is to reach as many alumni as they can, including those who have given in the past and those who might give for the first time.

"This position has given me the ability to talk to individuals I have never met and to be confident," said Edinboro senior Paul Bliss of Erie. "You have to be prepared when talking to them so you can build a relationship with this person. Know what you are going to say ahead of time."

Scripts were prepared for the students to assist them when making their calls. But half way through the semester, the students became familiar with their tasks, and the scripts were no longer needed. Bliss continued saying, "We personalize our calls. We tell alumni what's happening on campus, and inform them about renovations, technology, improvements, and beautifications on campus."

The Phonathon staff consists of 30 students who were screened extensively and hired by the Development Office.

> Qualifications for these positions include a positive personality and excellent social skills. Before dialing their first phone number, this dedicated group completed an intensive three-day training program to prepare for their campus job. The end result produced a panel of students who are well-versed on the University and now learn about its history from the stories shared by our alumni on the phone.

The value of students contacting alumni during the Alumni Annual Fund is priceless. It not only benefits the University, but benefits the alumni and students in immeasurable ways. Since the Phonathon began this past fall, conversations have stirred memories and evoked emotions, and advice poured through the phone lines from alumni to students. But regardless of the conversation, all the calls have one thing in common - enthusiastic support for Edinboro University.


Amber Palomba, a freshman from Somerset, Pa., worked in the fast food industry while in high school and loves to talk to people. She said the Annual Phonathon is the perfect job for her. "I've learned how to communicate with people on the phone, said Palomba. "It was a challenge at first to try to get them to give a donation, but I've since learned how to make a good pitch for Edinboro University."

"Our students are enthusiastic and dedicated," said Marilyn Goellner, director of annual fund and stewardship. "Students contact alumni on Sunday afternoons from 2 to 5 p.m. and in the evenings, Sunday through Thursday, from 6 to 9 p.m. during the school year to ask for their support to the Alumni Annual Fund. The callers update alumni records, provide information on what's happening on campus, and answer any questions alumni may have about Edinboro."

"I am incredibly proud of the students and how well they are doing," said Goellner. "They are knowledgeable about current events and renovations on campus and are doing more than fundraising - they are building

experience for the students, but also to make the experience fun. Each week, creative games add a bit of excitement and challenge to the evening phone calls. And yes, the winners do receive well-deserved prizes such as gift certificates, Edinboro apparel, and most importantly, food donated by Edinboro employees.

"I've learned that it's important to give back to your University," said Palomba. "They



do so much for you throughout your four years here. Edinboro is such a great place with many graduates. I can't wait for the first call I receive after I graduate to tell them that I was a phonathon caller and will gladly give them money."

As part of the *Campaign for Excellence* – only the second capital campaign in the University's history, the Phonathon helps to provide continuing funding to student endowments for academics and athletics. With more than 85 percent of Edinboro students receiving some form of financial aid, our Phonathon students are not only calling alumni to ask for support, but they also call to thank them for the great opportunities and experiences students receive today at Edinboro because of their generous donations.

To date, Capital Campaign pledges have been received from current and retired faculty and staff. The initial phase of the campaign also acquired gifts from businesses and corporations, members of the Council of Trustees, the Alumni Association Board of Directors and the Edinboro University Foundation Board of Directors. The successful public phase produced close to \$9 million in contributions from these constituents. Now, the last stretch of our campaign reaches out to Edinboro University alumni with nearly 50,000 being asked to give a once-in-a-lifetime gift to the *Campaign for Excellence* to help ensure that the Edinboro experience will be as rich for future generations as it was for them.

Edinboro Faculty Research... World-Wide Implications

Professor involves students in local research; carries out relevant watershed research at home and abroad

On March 26, 2004, Dr. Eric Straffin, a professor in the geosciences department at Edinboro University, presented a paper at the Northeastern Section (39th Annual) and Southeastern Section (53rd Annual) Joint Meeting of the Geological Society of America (GSA), in Washington, D. C. The

paper was titled "Involving Undergraduates in Research: Short Term, Inquiry-Based Projects with Long Term Goals." The paper discussed the benefits of involving undergraduate students in ongoing research. Students gain experience with research methods, and they have a field location from which they can collect data and formulate hypotheses. In the classroom, then, students are able to analyze results, test their hypotheses, and receive feedback on their projects and conclusions. Straffin puts this idea into practice in his teaching.

One project that he uses in this way is an ongoing study of Edinboro Lake. The students climb aboard the University-owned pontoon boat and, using a bathymetrical map created

by geosciences department chairman Dr. Brian Zimmerman, take core samples from sediment at various locations on the lake bottom. Zimmerman has been researching Edinboro Lake for many years in an effort to verify reports that the lake has been in-filling rapidly. The deepest core they generally collect is four to five meters (approximately 12 - 15 feet). The samples are examined for the pattern and types of sediment, which can tell the researcher rates of material deposits before and during urbanization and agricultural development.

The research is exploring the hypothesis that urbanization has negatively impacted the lake quality, resulting in rapid infilling. According to results collected and analyzed by Straffin and his students, however, changes in the lake quality are related to the natural processes of eutrophication, organic sedimentation, and soil-erosion. Although human land-use patterns can accelerate the processes involved in eutrophication, sampling at Edinboro Lake suggests that the

rate of sedimentation appears to have been uniform over the past 2,000 years. One of Straffin's students, Andrea Winger, also presented a paper detailing her research on the topic at the GSA meeting in Washington.

Straffin believes the inclusion of fieldwork tends to increase

enthusiasm of students regarding their educational experience. And he should know. He began his undergraduate career at Clarion University working toward a B.S. degree in biology, but became a little frustrated by all the slide work. At the same time, he began going on field trips with his geology classes. He made the switch to geosciences and never looked back, although he continues to work closely with biologists and environmentalists in his current research. He continued his education with an M.S. degree in geology from Northern Arizona University, and his Ph.D. in geology from the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. Straffin joined the Edinboro University faculty in 2000, after completing his dissertation.

In the classroom, then, students are able to analyze results, test their hypotheses, and receive feedback on their projects and conclusions.

His students have recently benefited from his enthusiasm, field of expertise, and teaching style by going out on a field trip to see the "cool flood deposits" on the Conneauttee Creek below the Edinboro dam resulting from the aftermath of Hurricane Frances in September.

Regionally, Straffin recently completed work on The State of the Stream Report, French Creek, Pennsylvania (2003), in conjunction with the Western Pennsylvania Conservancy, the French Creek Project, and others. The purpose of this report is to gather baseline data about French Creek and the surrounding watershed in an effort to determine the effects of human land-use, and to keep the public informed on the health of this pristine, unique ecological resource.

Straffin has collected data on the physical conditions of French Creek to establish baselines to be used in future monitoring projects. For example, he has examined the physical attributes of the streambed (geomorphology); the velocity, flow,

and clarity of the water (hydrology); and sediment types and patterns (sedimentology). This information will be used, along

with the biological data compiled by other parties involved in the research, to establish the current state of French Creek and allow the team to monitor changes over time as land-use patterns change. The researchers hope that this study will identify ways in which landowners influence the watershed, and ways to minimize threats to the ecological health of the region through recommendations for better land-use management practices. Along with local and regional projects, Straffin has also been working for the past four summers in central France. He has been continuing the work of his dissertation, Fluvial Response to Climate Change and Human Activities, Burgundy, France (University of

Nebraska-Lincoln, 2000), which focused on a 60-mile area in the Loire and Arroux River Valleys in central France. According to Straffin, this latest project is part of a larger, National Science Foundation-funded project directed by Dr. M. Blum, from Louisiana State University. This research expanded to include the Garonne and Rhone River Valleys, and is examining ways in which climate and sea-level changes have affected river dynamics. The implications of this research include predictions or insights into how river systems may respond to global warming.

Like El Niño or La Niña on the Pacific, changes in the Atlantic atmosphere have affected the European climate in the past, which has, in turn, affected the dynamics of rivers.


Dr. Straffin examined the physical effects from these climate shifts, human land use and urbanization, and tectonics by

analyzing sedimentation and then compared his findings with land-use and climate records. France has a long history of meticulous record-keeping – ask any medievalist. That was one reason the Loire Valley was selected for this research.

Straffin's research project in the Loire Valley suggests that as the climate in central Europe shifted over the past 140,000 years, the course, velocity, and condition of the Loire and Arroux rivers changed. These changes can be traced to climate shifts as the human land-use in the region has changed very little, even over the past few hundred years. His conclusions in this research demonstrate that shifts in the river dynamics correlate with big climate changes. This suggests potential

for change in river systems in response to global warming, along with predicting some specific changes that might be expected. This, of course, has world-wide implications due to the current trend toward global warming.

Straffin has taught numerous courses in his four years at Edinboro, including Dynamic Earth, Intro to Earth Environments, Earth History, Field Geology, Geology of San Salvador, Bahamas, Stratigraphy/Sedimentation, and Soil Geomorphology. At first glance, Dave Simile ('79) does not fit the stereotype of a CEO of a multimillion dollar corporation. More often than not, Simile's business attire is a sport shirt and blue jeans, belying his role as executive vice president of CDL Nuclear Technologies, a rapidly growing company on the verge of dominating the nuclear cardiac imaging industry.

Ten years ago, Simile joined long-time friend Keith Loiselle as a partner in his new company that provided mobile diagnostic services to hospitals, medical practices and clinics. Starting with just two other employees – a truck driver and a technologist – the company quickly grew to more than 20 workers.

CDL found a niche market in the health care industry. By putting MRI, CAT scan, lithotripsy and Positron Emission Tomography (PET scan) and other diagnostic services on trucks, smaller hospitals and medical facilities were able to offer their patients the same testing services as larger hospitals. The concept was a hit, and within ten years the company had more than 150 employees and hundreds of customers in Pennsylvania, West Virginia, Ohio, Maryland, New York and Connecticut.

Success, however, became a mixed blessing. While the bottom line was good, the challenge of managing a company that large was not as rewarding.

"It was simply getting too big," said Simile.

Because they wanted to keep the business at a more manageable size, Simile and Loiselle split the company in August of 2003, retaining the nuclear medicine division and selling the rest to a competitor for \$50 million.

The core of their new enterprise is what Simile calls nuclear cardiology imaging. Most people become familiar with it when their doctor orders a stress test of their heart or through cardiac catheterization. Those tests typically involve radioactive dyes that may reveal

clogged arteries leading to reduced blood flow to the heart.

Like the original business, the service is portable, meaning the equipment can be easily wheeled right into a doctor's office.


Shortly after the new company was formed, CDL's technical personnel put

their heads together and came up with a design for a new nuclear camera called the CDLCAM nuclear camera. Simile says it is faster, easier to use, and provides better diagnostic information than any other camera on the market.

e market.

The camera is used imagily for cardiac stress.

primarily for cardiac stress testing. It takes a snapshot of fluid passing through the heart in what Simile calls



The CDLCAM camera takes sharper images with more useful information for cardiologists than any previous camera. The whole process takes only about 30 seconds – a big improvement over previous testing protocols.

Simile said their product is FDA approved and has been beta tested at medical facilities in Florida, South Carolina, Ohio and Pennsylvania. They

placed eight cameras in the first six months of operation and had more than 30 in the field by the end of a year.

The camera is being built by GVI Technologies of Cleveland. CDL Nuclear Technologies is the exclusive distributor of the camera. Their strategy for marketing the

camera is nearly as brilliant as the camera itself. Instead of selling each camera for several hundred thousand dollars,

Simile said they are giving the camera to medical facilities at no cost. The revenue will come from charging a fee per scan. Simile estimates there are more than 3,000 potential customers for the camera nationwide. With each camera generating thousands of dollars in revenue per month, the potential income for their company is staggering.

Simile's success did not come overnight. He and Loiselle routinely put in 14-hour days, seven days a week with their original company. Once their new company is established, Simile hopes to take some time off and perhaps retire early.

"I want to travel extensively and see the world," said Simile. "I'll still maintain a home here (in the Pittsburgh area) but I would like to relocate part of the year to Florida."

Participation in sports has always been an important part of his life. Recently, he has become involved in motorsports as a hobby, competing in a racing circuit this summer in Beaver County. He also enters his Dodge Viper in "driving instruction" events at race courses such as Watkins Glen and Mid Ohio.

High on his list of things to do is become reacquainted with Edinboro University. His desire is fueled by many great memories of his life as a student at his alma mater. Simile and his brother Robert visited the campus as guests of President Frank Pogue in September when Edinboro hosted West Virginia Tech. Coincidentally, Robert Simile is a professor in that school's art department, and is a graduate of Indiana State University, the same school that produced Edinboro Athletic Director Bruce Baumgartner.

"Edinboro was a blast," said Simile. He remembers fondly being on his own, establishing lifelong relationships and especially the house he and his friends shared on Lakeside Drive. After graduating from Shaler High School in 1974, Simile enrolled at West Virginia Wesleyan for a year and a half. He decided to transfer to Edinboro because many of his friends went there, and he would have the chance to play football. He joined the Fighting Scots as a walk-on, but by his junior year he was starting at running back and played for two years before graduating in 1979 with a degree in business.

In less than a year he got a job selling photocopiers. He eventually joined the Sharp corporation where he became a sales manager and regional distribution manager before joining Loiselle in 1994.

When he is not spending time on his wooded, 11-acre homestead outside of Zelienople, Simile likes to join several of his friends skiing, golfing, whitewater rafting, or deep-sea fishing, which they do two or three times a year in places like Costa Rica and Cabo San Lucas.

Simile's success – whether it has been selling copiers, creating a multi-million dollar business, or competing on the racetrack or the gridiron – can in large part be credited to his optimism about life. "I've always had a positive attitude about everything I do," he said. "You get out of life what you put into it."

CAMPUS CONSTRUCTION PROJECTS



Louis C. Cole Auditorium - Memorial Hall

Following completion of major internal renovations to Memorial Hall, the University recently put the finishing touches on the exterior of the building with installation of glass doors and arched windows in the entranceway. Cost: \$60,000.

Dearborn Hall

The complete renovation of Dearborn Hall is underway which, like its sister residence hall Earp, will result in a greatly enhanced living environment for students. The most noticeable change to the building is the relocation of the main entrance to the campus side of the building. Cost: \$3.9 million.



Butterfield Hall

The education building is undergoing a complete life-cycle renovation. Construction is expected to be completed in May 2005. Cost: \$3.9 million.



University Center

Plans are currently being finalized before the University's hub of student activity undergoes a complete renovation and expansion. Completion of the project is anticipated in spring 2007. Cost: \$9 million.



Baron Forness Library

Following a \$300,000 project this year to replace the roof, planning is underway for the library to receive significant structural improvements. The project is expected to begin in the spring of 2005 and be completed by June 2006. Cost: \$800,000.

Academy Hall

Designs for the complete renovation of Academy Hall are underway and will be completed in July 2005. The anticipated construction completion date for the University's oldest building is December 2006. Cost: \$1.25 million.

Institute for Human Services and Civility

The University's newest building, to be located on the southwest side of Mallory Lake, is expected to have its design phase completed by July 2005. Construction of the building would be completed in December, 2006. Cost: \$4,166,000.



Heather Hall

A new building will be constructed to replace the current music building, which was originally a women's residence hall. The design phase is expected to be completed in December 2005, with construction completed by February 2007. Cost: \$1.9 million.

Scranton and Shafer Halls

Following the completion of the Earp Hall and Dearborn Hall renovation projects, the University will begin renovation of Scranton and Shafer residence halls. The anticipated completion date is January 2008. Cost: \$10 million.



Cooper Hall

The University is in the early stages of what may be one of the biggest construction projects in the University's history – the renovation and expansion of Cooper Hall. The architectural selection process is expected to begin in the spring of 2005 and the final

design is expected to be completed in the fall of 2006. The project would then be slated to be finalized in the summer of 2009. Cost: \$18 million.

MARI K. EDER... A Leader by Example

It was cold and dark on the flight line at Dover Air Force Base the night of November 17th. A Marine officer, an Air Force officer and Mari K. Eder stood at attention and saluted as 24 Marines, soldiers and civilians made their final return to American soil from battlefields half a world away. As the senior Department of the Army representative, Brigadier General Eder and the other officers rendered honors along with the Army, Marine and Air Force Honor Guards and an Air Force chaplain as one by one, the 24 flag-draped coffins were carried from the plane.

Typically, no one else attends this simple, dignified arrival ceremony. There are no welcoming crowds, no music. The Department of the Army calls this ceremony for the

repatriation of remains one of rending dignified honors. It is a tough duty and on this night the ceremony itself seemed particularly long. Everyone was stiff from standing at the position of attention for nearly three hours as the evening chill settled in. "It was more than my duty to be there that evening," Eder said. "It was a privilege and I am proud to have represented the Army at the honors ceremony."

Eder, a native of Stoneboro, Pa., in Mercer County, recently became the highest ranking female officer (Deputy Chief) in the U.S. Army's Department of Public Affairs. As she saluted the fallen soldiers, Eder thought of a

poster she stops to look at every day in one of the large corridors near her office in the Pentagon. It contains photos of Army Reserve soldiers killed in Afghanistan and Iraq. Above the photos on the poster is a simple phrase: "We memorialize these soldiers' lives by the actions we take as leaders."

Since her days as yearbook editor at Edinboro University to her current roles in the upper echelons of the Pentagon, Eder has always been a leader by example.

Eder came to Edinboro University in 1971 after graduating from Lakeview High School. She earned a B.A. degree in English

and graduated *cum laude* in 1975, and received her master's degree in English with honors in 1976. In addition to serving on the yearbook staff, Eder worked in the sports information office under Paul Newman ('64). One of her earliest assignments was taking photos at football games and writing sports press releases. She also joined a sorority – Zeta Tau Alpha – and became its historian.

"I never wanted to leave Edinboro," said Eder. "I couldn't imagine leaving. I loved the college, the lake, the people, everything but the weather."

But after obtaining her master's degree she was influenced by several friends from Edinboro to join the Army because of their positive experiences in the service.

In April of 1977 she was commissioned as a 2nd Lt. in the

Women's Army Corps and began her steady upward climb through the ranks. Eder was promoted to 1st Lt. two years later and became Capt. in the spring of 1981, before leaving the Active Army in September 1982. She was promoted to Maj. in 1989, Lt. Col. in 1996 and full Col. in April of 2001.

As part of her ongoing training, Eder enrolled in the U.S. Army War College in Carlisle, Pa., in 1999. Two years of distance education and 30 papers later she obtained a Master of Strategic Studies degree (MSS). In the midst of this she found time to reprise her Edinboro days as a member of the War College's yearbook staff.

Currently Eder holds two positions. In addition to her role in the Army Reserves as Deputy Chief of Public Affairs, she also holds the civilian post of Director of Strategic Communications for the Assistant Secretary of Defense for Homeland Defense, which is the Department of Defense's part of the national program at the Department of Homeland Security.

The past six months have been a whirlwind for Eder as the Army's demands have grown during the conflict in Iraq. In May she traveled to Qatar to assess the U.S. Central Command's strategic communications, spoke at the University of Maryland commissioning ceremony, spoke at the Pacific Command's public

affairs conference in Honolulu, and participated in other events at the War College and the Army's Missile and Munitions command in Huntsville, Alabama.

Eder's military career began in Alabama at Fort McClellan. Although she wanted to go into public affairs initially, she learned those positions aren't available to new officers. Instead, she joined the Military Police and held a number of positions at Fort McClellan and Fort Meade, Maryland.

From 1982 until 2001 Eder served in Army Reserve units. Her first assignment with a Public Affairs unit came in 1984 with the 80th Division in Richmond, Va. She was mobilized and returned to active duty in the initial wave of callups following September 11, 2001. She served full time then in what had been her part-time position, as Assistant Director of Public Affairs at the United States European Command in Stuttgart, Germany. In September of 2002 she became senior policy advisor, then Chief of Staff in the office of the Secretary of Defense, Reserve Forces Policy Board in Washington, D.C. In an unusual move, she also served as commander of a Reserve Training Brigade during that time.

Eder's service has not gone unrecognized by the Army. During her 27-year career she has received the Meritorious Service Medal with five Oak Leaf Clusters, the Joint Service Commendation Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters, the Army Commendation Medal with three Oak Leaf Clusters, the Joint Service Achievement Medal and the Army Achievement Medal.

Perhaps the most ironic thing about Eder's service is that she never consciously decided to make the Army her career. After leaving active duty the first time in 1982 she joined the reserves with the intention of staying only as long as it was fun. If a public affairs position hadn't been open in 1984 she might have left then.

But she has stayed with the Army primarily for two reasons: the relationships and the opportunity to lead and


command. She has met people from all over the country and from all walks of life. At her promotion ceremony to Brigadier General in October, friends from Illinois, Mississippi, Oklahoma, and Alabama came to show their support. Edinboro University was represented by Terry Carlin, assistant vice president for admissions and his wife, Jerri, who was Eder's roommate in college.

Eder said the most rewarding part of her job is having a positive leadership affect on the people she commands. "It's rewarding to see people become successful," said Eder. "It's the ability to say, 'Let me share with you what I wish I knew when I was in your position.' Then you watch them apply it and succeed."



Eder's career - both as a civilian and an officer has been marked by increasing levels of leadership and responsibility. Her more notable assignments have included:

- Serving as Director of Public Affairs at the George C. Marshall European Center for Security Studies where she conducted international press relations and built a major training program from the ground up. She traveled to more than 23 countries in this position and taught media relations in the Balkans, Russia and to the Baltic nations in Stockholm Sweden.
- Serving as Deputy Director for Communications and Public Information at the Transportation Security Administration.
- Establishing communications policy for all U.S. forces in Europe as Deputy Director of Public Affairs for the U.S. European Command.
- Serving as senior Reserve component policy advisor to the chairman of the OSD Reserve Forces Policy Board and its 24-member general officer member board.

Dr. Roy Strausbaugh was born in New Jersey and grew up in Pennsylvania. Roy was a graduate of the Navy School of Music, serving in the United States Navy from 1954 to 1958, with three years at sea. After service in the Navy, he graduated from Millersville State College. His graduate studies (in history) include an M.A. from Indiana University (Bloomington, Indiana) and Ph.D. from Case Western Reserve University.

Dr. Strausbaugh's career at Edinboro University began in 1966 as instructor in the social studies department. He served in a variety of positions at Edinboro until his retirement in 1993, including: dean of academic administration, dean of continuing education, associate vice president for administration and student life, president of Edinboro University Services, Inc., chair of the history department, and professor of history. Dr. Strausbaugh authored Edinboro University: An Administrative History, 1963-1993, published in 1996.

Dr. Strausbaugh serves on the Flagship Niagara League and was its founding president. He has been widely recognized for his community and academic service, and on February 11, 2003, President Pogue presented Dr. Strausbaugh with the Award of Excellence at the Fourth Annual Frank G. Pogue Honors Scholarship Luncheon. The award recognized Dr. Strausbaugh's career in higher education, particularly his contributions as a professor, dean and associate vice president at Edinboro, his teaching and service to Mercyhurst, as well as his contributions as a trustee of Thiel College.

Dr. Strausbaugh is a founding member of the Edinboro University Foundation Board of Directors and continues to be an active director. He currently serves as Academic Advisor, Adult and Graduate Programs & Institutional Research at Mercyhurst College.

Rosanna (Sweden) Strausbaugh was born in Philadelphia and raised in Horsham, Pa. She received her bachelor's degree in elementary education from Millersville State College

in 1961. Roy and Rosanna were married in 1961 and both initially taught in public schools in Lancaster County. Rosanna received her master's degree in education from Indiana University (Bloomington, Indiana) in 1966. She taught in Lancaster and Erie County schools for 35 years, retiring from the Millcreek Township School District after 30 vears at Chestnut Hill Elementary School. Retired, Rosanna currently volunteers at Hamot Medical Center.

Dr. Strausbaugh's mother, Emma Irene Peters Strausbaugh, born and raised in York, Pa., was a profound influence in Roy's decision to become a teacher.

Mrs. Strausbaugh is a graduate of Shippensburg Normal School, and earned her bachelor's degree in elementary education at Millersville State College. She began her teaching career of

45 years in a one-room school house in rural York County at the age of 20. After teaching 35 years in the York area, she moved to Fort Myers, Florida, where she taught ten more years. At 95, she remains active and healthy living in Ft. Myers.

Dr. and Mrs. Strausbaugh have long been advocates of Edinboro University and have demonstrated a strong commitment to higher education. This schola-

rship is representative not only of their generosity, but also their strong belief in the importance of providing students with every opportunity to achieve their educational goals.

Urteaga was one of the Mexican delegates in the NAFTA negotiating process covering several provisions of the agreement. His current responsibilities include being co-lead Mexican negotiator of the U.S.-Mexico Bilateral Safety Aviation Agreement. He is also involved in the promotion of the NAFTA in the United States and in the development of U.S.-Mexico business expansion and investment.

The featured presentation was followed by a lively open forum and

HONORS PROGRAM NAMED FOR PROVOST

Jessica Wilson was pleased to see Robert Weber, Ph.D., honored by his peers.

"I think that naming the program after him is the perfect way to

thank him for all of his service to the university," Wilson said. "Dr. Weber's previous experience as a professor and teacher made him an excellent university staff member because of his ability to relate to student and faculty concerns."

Wilson, of Saegertown, is a sophomore biology major at Edinboro. She is also an honors student pleased with the University's decision to re-name its program the Dr. Robert C. Weber Honors Program.

University President Frank Pogue unveiled a large plaque to re-name the program during Fall Convocation and Founder's Day ceremonies held recently at Earp Hall.

"This program opens a lot of doors," Wilson said. "We have opportunities to travel abroad and take accelerated courses."

Weber was gratified by the accolades. "This is truly an unexpected honor," he said. "I look around and see things pretty much the same as they were when I started here."

Weber is university provost and vice president for academic affairs. He recently announced that he will retire from the university this December.

He will leave behind quite a legacy. During his tenure as provost, Weber led a systematic enhancement of the University honors program. He also worked on ways to increase funding for the honors scholarship program. The scholarship began in 1989 and has since awarded more than \$30,000.

In addition, Weber implemented master's degree programs in social work, secondary and middle level instruction and information technology and a collaborative master's in curriculum and instruction through the Northern Tier Educational Initiative.

He was also instrumental in creating baccalaureate programs in print journalism, broadcast journalism, Latin American studies, and forensic chemistry, as well as minors in Latin American studies, critical thinking, applied computer technology and applied mathematics.

And all of that, Weber said, was done with students in mind. "Is this the best decision for students," Weber said, was always his starting question.

Weber grew up on the south side of Pittsburgh, one of 11 children in his family. "College wasn't something that was talked about," he said, in his youth. "I was the first in my family to go to college."

At that time, Weber was fortunate that the state subsidized 90 percent of his education. "Now the state subsidizes about 40 percent," he said. "We need public higher education, and we need the support."

The former professor arrived at Edinboro University in 1989 as dean of liberal arts. He was appointed interim provost and vice president of academic affairs in 1995. A year later, he was appointed to those posts permanently.

During the Founder's Day celebration, former honors students spoke about Weber's dedication to education and students.

Ross Markle, who graduated in May with a degree in psychology, was especially pleased to see Weber recognized. "Dr. Weber cherished the honors program," Markle said. "Everyone is worried about the 'No Child Left Behind Law,' and Dr. Weber did his best to make sure students moved ahead."



DR. PEARL BARTELT NAMED PROVOST

President Pogue recently announced the appointment of Dr. Pearl W. Bartelt to the position of Provost

and Vice President for Academic Affairs effective January 3, 2005. Dr. Bartelt currently serves as senior fellow at the Association of American Colleges and Universities (AAC&U). She will replace Provost Robert Weber who will retire in December.

"It is an honor to have a scholar and administrator with Dr. Bartelt's credentials join the Edinboro Family," said Dr. Pogue. "Her experience as a professor, dean, and provost at the university level, coupled with her work at AAC&U will be highly valuable in advancing the mission of the University."

Dr. Bartelt was educated at Ohio State University where she received a B.S. degree in education and M.A. and Ph.D. degrees in sociology. She began her career at the collegiate level as an assistant professor at the Community College of Philadelphia. She later served as assistant, associate and full professor at Glassboro State College (now Rowan University) in New Jersey. She was appointed dean of liberal arts and sciences at Rowan University in 1991; became vice president for academic affairs at Central Connecticut State University in 1999 and provost in 2001; and joined AAC&U in 2003. She also served as a visiting senior research fellow at England's University of Surrey from 1985 to 1986.

Her memberships include the American Association of Higher Education, a

board member of the American Conference of Academic Deans, the American Sociological Association, the Council of Colleges of Arts and Sciences, board member and past president of the International Communal Societies Association, and past board member and treasurer of the Communal Societies Association.

In her letter of application, Dr. Bartelt expressed her life-long support for public education at all levels, stating, "A public university provides higher education access, intellectual capital and a significant institutional asset to both the immediate community and to the state as a whole. I firmly believe that the community strengthens the university and the university strengthens the community."

DON APEL JOINS EDINBORO UNIVERSITY IN MEADVILLE

Don C. Apel of Meadville has been appointed the outreach coordinator for Edinboro University of Pennsylvania in Meadville. Located in the former Bessemer site, Edinboro University in Meadville provides access to affordable post-secondary education for the residents of Crawford and nearby counties in northwestern Pennsylvania. Apel will be responsible for developing, coordinating and planning education and training programs at this location.

In announcing the appointment, Edinboro President Frank G. Pogue noted Apel's experience in cooperative educational programs. "Don has

worked closely with the local NTMA and school faculty over the years to bring technology programs into Meadville High School and in developing summer internships for students interested in entering technology and tooling careers. His leadership will be invaluable as Edinboro University continues to expand its educational offerings in Meadville and Crawford County."



Prior to his appointment, Apel was the director of secondary guidance for the Crawford Central School District where he was employed for 33 years holding the positions of teacher, coach and guidance counselor. He has worked closely with the Meadville community and business leaders while serving on numerous community, school, and agency committees and advisory boards.

Apel obtained his bachelor's degree in health and physical education from Slippery Rock University and his master's degree in education, secondary guidance and counseling from Edinboro University. He also has completed several courses in student personnel services and school administration at Edinboro.

Don resides in Meadville with his wife, Patty, a health and physical education teacher at Meadville High School.

John A. Pulice Appointed Trustee





Pulice is retired from his position as the Erie area manager for the Department of Revenue-Pennsylvania State Lottery. His appointment to the Council of Trustees was effective on September 21, 2004.

Edinboro University's financial services curriculum in business administration and economics has received a five-year renewal from June 1, 2004 until May 31, 2009, with Certified Financial Planning Board of Standards Inc. (CFP Board). Graduates of a registered financial planning program meet the educational requirements to take the CFP® Certification Examination.

To earn the CERTIFIED FINANCIAL PLANNER™ certification, one must meet its educational standards, pass the CFP® Certification Examination, satisfy a work experience requirement and agree to abide by CFP Board's Code of Ethics and Professional Responsibility and Financial Planning Practice Standards.

The financial services program at Edinboro is a concentration within the bachelor of science in business administration major. It is designed to prepare students for careers in investment planning and management in such fields as insurance, real estate, and securities and commodities investment.

In Edinboro's course of study, students learn principles of money and banking, tax accounting, investments, personal financial planning, retirement planning, risk management, estate planning and business law.

Edinboro University does not certify individuals to use the CFP® CERTIFIED FINANCIAL PLANNERTM, and CFP (with flame logo)® marks. CFP certification is granted solely by Certified Financial Planner Board of Standards Inc. to individuals who, in addition to completing an educational requirement such as this CFP Board-Registered Program, have met its ethics, experience and examination requirements. Only persons registered with CFP Board are permitted to sit for the CFP® Certification Examination. Certified Financial Planner Board of Standards Inc. owns the marks CFP®, CERTIFIED FINANCIAL PLANNERTM, and CFP (with flame logo)®, which it awards to individuals who successfully complete initial and ongoing certification requirements.







PEYRONEL PUBLISHES ARTICLE IN INTERNATIONAL JOURNAL



Dr. Anthony Peyronel, a member of Edinboro's speech and communication studies department, published an article in the February 2004 issue of *The Case International Journal of Educational Advancement*. The article, titled "Media Scrutiny of Higher Education: An Ongoing Challenge and Long-Term Trend," builds

on Peyronel's dissertation study that examined public relations management in the State System of Higher Education.

In the article, Peyronel dismisses the idea that negative media coverage of higher education is a new trend, pointing out that colleges and universities have been subjected to increasing levels of media scrutiny for the last 20 years. He recommends that college and university public relations professionals include media relations as part of their integrated marketing efforts.

Peyronel is program coordinator of the undergraduate programs in speech communication and broadcast journalism. He also serves as faculty advisor to the Edinboro University chapter of the Public Relations Student Society of America.

Edinboro University Faculty Member Receives National Science Foundation Grant

Edinboro professor Dr. Elisabeth Joyce was awarded a \$31,360 grant from the National Science Foundation to study Human-Computer Interaction (HCI).

HCI is the study of how people interact with computers, how the computers make them feel and whether the computers' designs fit



their physical, psychological and mental needs and capabilities. Considering the growing importance of computers in our everyday lives, HCI aims to make products more user-friendly.

Joyce's project, "Stickiness: Predicting Continued Participation in Newsgroups," will study what constitutes loyalty among members of online communities and how these communities are formed through the medium of computers. The NSF Grant will allow Joyce to expand her study and work with a broader sampling of communities and a larger database of statistics.

The National Science Foundation is an independent agency of the United States Government, created in 1950. The purpose of the Foundation is to promote progress in science, advance national health, prosperity and welfare and secure the national defense. The Foundation, located in North Arlington, Virginia, consists of 24 part-time members and a director. All are appointed by the President of the United States and approved by the Senate.

Edinboro Receives Record Amount in External Grants

Edinboro University received more than \$2.5 million in externally funded grants during the 2003-04 fiscal year, making it the highest amount received in the history of the University. A total of 88 new and ongoing grant proposals and projects were awarded totaling \$2,653,362, a 26 percent increase over the previous year's funding of \$1,826,487.

"We are proud of this success as it exemplifies our efforts to assist the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania in funding the University's aspirations" said President Pogue. "Our faculty and staff are committed to doing all that is possible to ensure that students have access to excellent programs, research opportunities, and related services."

"Edinboro University faculty and staff have worked tirelessly to secure extramural funding during the 2003-04 academic year," said Dr. Mary M. Bevevino, dean of graduate studies and research. "Their efforts and the results are both impressive and commendable."

Twelve grants were awarded from federal funding agencies totaling \$920,456. Edinboro University received the largest number of external grants from state funding agencies – 37 in the amount of \$1,207,275; and 20 grants in the amount of \$425,631 were received from private funding agencies.

Federal grant dollars have allowed Edinboro to partner with other education institutions in bringing educational programming to elementary students and college students at Warren Elementary School, Edinboro University, Indiana University of Pennsylvania, and Slippery Rock University. Grants have enabled several rural and city high school students to participate in a variety of programs to enhance their studies while at the same time encouraging them to further their education in a post-secondary setting. Several faculty from Edinboro have also been awarded money for research, and a variety of concerts, lectures and conferences were held on campus that were funded by grants.

TRUSTEES RECOMMEND CONTRACT EXTENSION

Edinboro University's Council of Trustees voted unanimously to recommend the extension of President Pogue's contract by one year to 2007. This vote came following the Trustees' annual review of presidential leadership that is conducted as called for in Act 188, the enabling legislation for the Pennsylvania State System of Higher Education, and as directed by Board of Governors policy.

A four-person presidential review committee appointed by Trustee Chair Harry Thomas provided leadership for the review process. The committee was composed of Trustees John Horan, C. Richard Johnston, Jordan Ritter, and Catherine Manning, S.S.J., who served as chair.

Edinboro University Marks Record Graduate Enrollment

Edinboro University has set an all-time high enrollment in its graduate programs. Dr. Peg Bevevino, dean of graduate studies, said enrollment is at a record high 1,038 students. Bevevino credits a wider variety of graduate programs, five online programs, and greater outreach as reasons for continuing growth in the University's graduate programs.

This is the second year in a row Edinboro has had record enrollment in its graduate programs. Last year saw an increase of 20 percent from 2002. Edinboro's graduate studies program has students from 70 undergraduate institutions in 15 states and several countries.

New Graduate Programs Announced

Edinboro University is now offering several new graduate-level programs and alternative delivery methods for other successful campus-based graduate programs.

A new post-master's program has been developed for school administrators who wish to become a superintendent or assistant superintendent of a school district, or executive director of an Intermediate Unit. The program will lead students in the program to become qualified for Pennsylvania's Letter of Eligibility and is open to graduate students who have a Master of Education degree and hold a Pennsylvania principal or supervisor certificate.

The new program is being offered at Edinboro University in Erie – The Porreco Center and Edinboro University in Meadville. Graduate students can now enroll at Edinboro and transition seamlessly from the Master of Education in educational leadership to the post-master's program in K-12 principal certification, and finish with the new Letter of Eligibility program.

Speech and Communication Studies – The Department of Speech and Communication Studies is now offering a 12-credit Conflict Management Certificate program designed especially for those working in organizations and institutions where ongoing conflict or a crisis event impede the realization of goals and objectives and undermine productive relationship development internally and externally.

Elementary Education – The Instructional Technology Specialist I certification program was developed in response to an increasing demand to assist teachers and administrators in the integration of technology in the classrooms. The program provides a second certification to those candidates who already hold a teaching certificate. The program was designed to meet the needs of educators by providing instruction to students and teachers in the design of instructional strategies and their implementation and evaluation, adapting existing materials and assisting teachers in the design and production of original materials to meet specific instructional goals; and assisting administrators by providing preservice programs for staff.

Professional Studies – In addition to the traditional campus-based offering of K-12 principal certification coursework, a post-master's certification program is also available online. Beginning in January 2005, the University will be offering the M.Ed. in Educational Leadership online.

Secondary Education – The Department of Secondary Education is pleased to announce the online Master of Education in Middle and Secondary Instruction, in addition to the traditional campus-based program. The online program was designed to incorporate the Behavior Management Certificate as part of the planned program of study. The inclusion of this certificate provides students with the opportunity for an area of concentration or specialization as part of the master's degree.

Special Education and School Psychology – The Department of Special Education and School Psychology began its third online Master of Education in Special Education cohort this past fall.




Total Eclipse of the Moon

SETH FRAGALE NAMED PSAC WEST DEFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE YEAR

Eleven Fighting Scots Named to All-PSAC West Football Squads





A total of 11 Edinboro football players were named to the All-PSAC West teams. Edinboro currently has a 9-2 record after defeating Bentley, 47-44, in the first round of the NCAA Division II Northeast Regional on Saturday. The Fighting Scots finished with a share of the PSAC West crown for the second straight year.

Leading the Edinboro contingent was junior Seth Fragale who was recognized as the Defensive Player of the Year. Fragale is a 6'2", 217-lb. outside linebacker who leads the Fighting Scots with

92 tackles, including 11 for losses of 69 yards, with a teamhigh 5.5 sacks, a pair of interceptions and 2 fumble recoveries. He spearheads an Edinboro defense which ranks among the Division II leaders in rushing defense, giving up just 92.0 ypg. Fragale was a second team All-PSAC West choice a year ago.

In all, seven Fighting Scots were named to the first team. The aerial tandem of Justin Bouch and Justin Lipscomb were named to the first team for the second straight year. In addition, Greg Bzorek moved up from the second team to a spot on the first team, while Chris Kaczor and Chris Avery were named to the second team for the second consecutive season.

Bouch repeated as the first team quarterback. The 6'3", 200 lb. junior has completed 156 of 273 passes for 2,152 yards with 18 TDs and 10 INTs, adding 111 yards rushing and 2 TDs. He needs just 58 yards to set the single season record for yards passing, and 33 yards in total offense for the single season total offense standard. Bouch ranks third in career passing yards with 5,376 yards.

Lipscomb, a 6'0", 190 lb. junior wide receiver, has tied the school record for receptions with 50, good for 735 yards and 8 TDs. He has caught at least one pass in 33 straight games, and like Bouch ranks highly in the career statistics. Lipscomb is fifth in career receptions (112), third in career yards receiving (1,932), and fourth in career TD receptions (16).

Andre Burke rounds out the contingent of Edinboro's offensive players on the first team. The 5'10", 205 lb. junior is a finalist for the Harlon Hill Trophy and is nearing Edinboro's season rushing record. He has rushed for 1,675 yards on 274 carries with 18 TDs. He needs 24 yards to set the season rushing record currently held by Gerald Thompson with 1,698 yards, while also ranking second





in rushing touchdowns and tied for third in carries. Burke has topped the 100-yard mark in eight games this season, including three straight games with 200-or-more yards.

On the defensive side, sophomore A.J. Cousins earned a spot on the first team in his first season as a starter. The 6'1", 270 lb. noseguard has 47 tackles, with 8 for losses of 26 yards, and 4 sacks.

The seventh Edinboro player voted to the first team is placekicker Kody Robertson. The sophomore has made 11 of 13 field goals and

43 of 46 extra points for 76 points. His 11 field goals are tied for third on the season charts.

Bzorek and Kaczor have paced an Edinboro offensive line which has been outstanding this season after losing two All-Americans from a year ago. The 6'6", 318 lb. Bzorek is in his second year as the starter at right tackle and in his third season as a starter, starting in 34 of 35 games. Kaczor was named to the second team while playing left guard a year ago, and this season moved to center. He has started all 23 games in his career. The duo has helped Edinboro average 206.5 ypg. on the ground while allowing just 8 sacks. The line has only given up three sacks in the last eight games.

In addition to Kaczor, three other Fighting Scots were named to the second team, all on defense. Even more encouraging for the Fighting Scots, two are redshirt freshman. Chris Amico is a 6'0", 250 lb. redshirt freshman who has started all 11 games at defensive tackle. He leads the Edinboro interior linemen with 48 tackles, and is also tops on the squad with 12 tackles for losses of 62 yards. He ranks second with 4.5 sacks.

Two members of the secondary – both ranked among the Division II leaders in interceptions – complete the Edinboro honorees. Avery is a repeat performer, ranking second on the team with 6 interceptions and tied for the team lead with 5 passes broken up. The 5'9", 175 lb. junior cornerback has 37 tackles. He's joined by 6'1", 184 lb. redshirt freshman Tom Davidson. Davidson took over at free safety in the first game after All-American Raji El-Amin went down with an injury. He has proceeded to come up with 8 interceptions, one shy of El-Amin's school record of 9 set a year ago, for 117 yards and a touchdown. Davidson also has 31 tackles.

ASHLEY PULMAN NAMED PSAC WEST WOMEN'S SOCCER ROOKIE OF THE YEAR

Edinboro women's soccer coach Gary Kagiavas suffered through his first losing season since 1998, as his Fighting Scots finished with a 6-9-3 record. Despite four losses and a tie in the final six contests, Kagiavas liked what he saw in his young Fighting Scots, and apparently the rest of the PSAC coaches agreed.

Three Edinboro players were named to the 2004 All-PSAC West Women's Soccer Teams. Ashley Pulman landed a spot on the first team, and was also recognized as the Rookie of the Year. She is the first Fighting Scot player to win one of the PSAC's major awards. Elise Falatach, like Pulman a freshman, landed a spot on the second team along with junior Kathy Lantzy.

Pulman, a midfielder/forward, was a highly-regarded recruit a year ago who was forced to sit out the 2003 season after undergoing knee surgery during the summer. She was well worth the wait, leading the Fighting Scots with 5 goals and 6 assists for 16 points.

Falatach played in the midfield, as well. She finished as the third-leading scorer with 3 goals and 4 assists for 10 points. Lantzy is a defender who helped the Fighting Scots play solid defense. She keyed a defense which recorded five shutouts and gave up just 25 goals.

FOOTBALL, SOCCER PLAYERS RECOGNIZED AS DISTRICT ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICANS

A total of five Edinboro University athletes were recognized by CoSIDA (College Sports Information Directors of America) as District II Academic All-Americans. The list included three football players and two members of the women's soccer team.

For the football team, junior outside linebacker Seth Fragale was named to the CoSIDA District II Academic All-America College Division Football first team, while junior tight end Nate Eimer and sophomore center Chris Kaczor were selected to the second team. Fragale now goes on the national ballot, with the Division II Academic All-America team announced on December 1.

Junior defender Becky Hostettler was named to the CoSIDA District II Academic All-America College Division Women's Soccer second team, while junior midfielder Kathy Lantzy was selected to the third team.

Voting was conducted among members of the College Sports Information Directors of America for District II, comprising New Jersey, Pennsylvania, Maryland, Delaware, West Virginia and the District of Columbia.

WRESTLING TEAM HIGHLY-RANKED ENTERING 2004-05 SEASON

Yetzer, Bunch and Hennis Among Ranked Individuals

The Edinboro University wrestling team entered the 2004-05 season ranking as one of the top teams in the country. The Fighting Scots are ranked 19th in the NWCA/InterMat NCAA Division I Coaches Preseason Poll, while *W.I.N. Magazine* lists Edinboro 20th and The Wrestling Mall 22nd.

Edinboro finished the 2003-04 season with a 10-3 record, tying West Virginia for first place at the Eastern Wrestling League Tournament and winning the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference crown. The Fighting Scots went on to finish 24th at the NCAA Division I National Championships.

In addition to the team rankings, a number of individuals rank among the national leaders in their respective weight classes. Leading the way is Nate Yetzer. The senior wrestled at 174 lbs. a year ago, finishing with a 37-6 record and earning All-American honors with an eighth place finish. He moves down to 165 lbs. this year, with head coach Tim Flynn seeing him as a contender for the national championship. A year ago Matt King finished third at 165 lbs.

Yetzer is ranked fifth by InterMat, is sixth in the *Amateur Wrestling News* rankings, fourth according to *W.I.N. Magazine*, and is sixth in The Wrestling Mall poll, but at 174 lbs.

Shawn Bunch was redshirted a year ago and now returns seeking his third trip to Nationals. Bunch fell one win shy of All-American honors at 125 lbs. as a freshman, then lost two of three matches as a sophomore at 133 lbs. He is expected to challenge for All-American honors this year at 133 lbs., and is ranked seventh by InterMat and tenth by *Amateur Wrestling News. W.I.N. Magazine* has Bunch ranked seventh in its preseason poll, while The Wrestling Mall has him 11th. Bunch was 30-14 as a sophomore.

Heavyweight Joe Hennis made his first trip to Nationals a year ago. He lost both of his matches to finish 27-12. Hennis is ranked 18th in the InterMat poll, 19th by *Amateur Wrestling News*, 20th by The Wrestling Mall, and 17th by *W.I.N. Magazine*.

Eric Ring and Deonte Penn also appear in the national rankings, although in both instances that will change. Ring, a junior who was 11-15 a year ago while competing at 157 lbs., jumps up two weight classes to 174 lbs. *W.I.N. Magazine* has him ranked 20th at 157 lbs. Penn made his first trip to Nationals a year ago at 149 lbs., ending the year with a 27-13 record. A junior, he will redshirt this season while competing at 165 lbs. in open tournaments. Penn shows up in The Wrestling Mall rankings in the 20th position at 149 lbs.

JAKIM DONALDSON EARNS STREET & SMITH PRESEASON ALL-AMERICAN HONORS Senior Forward Named to Honorable Mention Team

Edinboro's Jakim Donaldson was named to the Street & Smith's 2004 College Basketball Preview All-American Team. The 6'8", 200 lb. forward was accorded preseason honorable mention All-American honors. He is the only player from the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference to earn All-American honors.

Donaldson helped Edinboro to a 14-14 finish a year ago, but the Fighting Scots finished second in the PSAC West with an 8-4 ledger. He earned first team All-PSAC West honors for the second straight



year, was an all-region choice, and was a second team Daktronics Division II All-East Region choice.

The senior averaged a double-double for the second straight year at 14.8 ppg. and 11.5 ppg.. He led the PSAC in rebounding while finishing second nationally, and was eighth in the PSAC in scoring and 11th in field goal percentage (51.5 pct.). In addition, he blocked 62 shots a year ago, good for second in the conference and 14th in Division II. All told, Donaldson finished with a PSAC-leading 17 double-doubles.


ANDRE BURKE ONE OF 26 CANDIDATES FOR HARLAN HILL TROPHY

Edinboro University tailback Andre Burke has been named one of six Northeast Regional finalists for the Harlon Hill Trophy as the NCAA Division II College Football Player of the Year. Burke is one of 26 candidates still in the running for Division II's equivalent of the Heisman Trophy.

Head coach Lou Tepper was pleased that Burke was gaining the recognition he deserves. "Andre's made a dramatic impact on our season," related Tepper. "His combination of balance, acceleration, strength and humility I think are very rare."

Burke has been one of the true success stories of 2004. The 5'10", 205 lb. junior had not played football prior to this year, attending California (Pa.) for a year but not playing for the Vulcans, then attending a junior college before joining Edinboro a year ago. He sat out the 2003 season, and while coming out of spring practices as the starter at tailback, head coach Lou Tepper and his staff weren't sure what they had.

All Burke has done is enjoy one of the greatest seasons ever by an Edinboro back. He ranks eighth in Division II in rushing with 1,675 yards on 274 carries with 18 TDs. Those numbers also put him in 15th in scoring and tied for 17th in all-purpose yardage. He has moved within 24 yards of breaking Gerald Thompson's single-season rushing record of 1,698 yards.

DELIBERATO SETS SCHOOL RECORD FOR CAREER DIGS

Senior Marissa DeLiberato was one of the bright spots for a young Edinboro University volleyball team that suffered its first losing season since 1995. The Fighting Scots finished the season with a 13-19 record, but along the way DeLiberato set school records for digs in a season and a career.

The 5'7" DeLiberato had 664 digs for the season, including 35 against Mercyhurst. The latter figure set a new standard for a fourgame match and was just one dig shy of the record for all matches. Her season dig total broke the previous record of 568 held by Stephanie Burner. DeLiberato also broke Burner's career record for digs, as well, finishing with 1,722. Burner had held the record with 1,707.

WOMEN'S BASKETBALL TEAM PICKED THIRD IN PSAC WEST PRESEASON POLL

The Edinboro University women's basketball team was picked for third place in the 2004-05 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Western Division Coaches preseason poll. The Fighting Scots finished the 2003-04 season with an 18-10 record, and were third in the Western Division with a 6-6 ledger.

To no one's surprise, defending national champion California (Pa.) was the preseason favorite with three starters returning.

Edinboro returns two players who started all 28 games a year ago, and head coach Stan Swank will also welcome back a pair of guards who missed considerable time due to injury. Maria DiVecchio enters her third season as a starter. She'll start at forward along with Megan Zitner, who is now fully recovered from a knee injury that forced her to miss the 2002-03 season.

Senior Jodi Calderone missed the entire PSAC West portion of the season a year ago due to a broken hand. The 5'5" guard is a strong defender and the team's top three-point threat. Junior Callie Iorfido takes over at point guard for Courtney Thompson. She ranked among the PSAC leaders in assists (100), steals (57) and assist-turnover ratio (100-56).

Junior guard Jessi Montie is sure to see plenty of playing time after averaging 7.0 ppg. last year. The guard corps is further bolstered with the addition of Calderone's sister, Kelly. A transfer from the University at Buffalo, the 5'8" sophomore is another strong outside shooter who averaged 5.1 ppg. with 18 three-pointers a year ago.

Edinboro opened the 2004-05 campaign on Friday, November 19, in the Millersville Classic.

MEN'S BASKETBALL TEAM PICKED THIRD IN PSAC WEST PRESEASON POLL

Donaldson, Sims Named To All-PSAC West Preseason Team

The Edinboro men's basketball team was picked for third place in the 2004-05 Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Western Division Coaches Preseason Poll. The Fighting Scots finished with a 14-14 record last season and were second in the Western Division with an 8-4 ledger.

Edinboro returns three starters, led by two-time All-PSAC West first team performer Jakim Donaldson. The 6'8" senior forward averaged a double-double for the second straight year at 14.8 ppg. and 11.5 rpg. Donaldson led the PSAC in rebounding and ranked second in Division II. He also ranked second in the PSAC in blocked shots with 62. Donaldson was chosen a Street & Smith's preseason honorable mention All-American. He stands ninth in career rebounds with 694, is fifth in career blocked shots with 133, and 31st in career scoring (850).

Donaldson and teammate Rob Sims were named to the All-PSAC West Preseason Team. Sims, a 6'3" guard, was a first team All-PSAC West choice two years ago and earned second team accolades a year ago. The senior averaged 14.4 ppg. while battling a season-long shooting slump. He added 4.8 rpg. with 59 assists. As a sophomore Sims averaged 17.0 ppg.

Dan Grabill returns alongside Sims in the backcourt. A 5'10" junior, Grabill averaged 8.2 ppg. with a team-leading 45 three-pointers after sitting out the 2002-03 season. He also paced the Scots with 65 assists.

The Fighting Scots should benefit greatly from the addition of three transfers. Torry Mitchell and Chris Ravello transferred from Mercyhurst and Canisius, respectively, and will bolster the backcourt. Mitchell is a 5'10" junior who averaged 6.3 ppg. a year ago for the Lakers, but as a freshman was at 14.1 ppg. with 70 three-pointers. Ravello is a 6'3" junior who sat out the 2003-04 campaign. A strong defensive performer, he averaged 4.1 ppg. for the Griffs as a sophomore but may need some time to shake off the rust.

Another player who may battle court rust is Daren Tielsch, a 6'8", 235 lb. junior who began his career at Penn State, then played one game at Robert Morris a year ago. Tielsch averaged 4.0 ppg. and 3.4 rpg. in x28 for the Nittany Lions in 2001-02.

Edinboro opened the 2004-05 campaign on Saturday, November 13, playing at West Virginia Wesleyan.

FIGHTING SCOTS ADVANCE IN NCAA PLAYOFFS WITH WIN AT BENTLEY

Suffer Heartbreaking Loss At East Stroudsburg

What a difference a week can make. The Edinboro University football team, selected for the NCAA Division II Playoffs for the second straight year, found that out the hard way in the Northeast Regional semifinal game. The Fighting Scots came up with a late defensive stand to stave off Bentley, 47-44, in the first round of the playoffs. But in week number two, events didn't go Edinboro's way, as East Stroudsburg's Mike Terwilliger completed a 17-yard touchdown pass to Ben Culver on a 4th-and-10 play to give the Warriors a 36-32 win over Edinboro.

For Edinboro, the playoff drama unfolded just after 1 p.m. on Sunday, November 6, with the announcement of the NCAA Division II Playoff field on ESPNews. There was Edinboro, listed as the sixth seed in the Northeast Region, set to play at third-seeded Bentley. It was everything head coach Lou Tepper could have hoped for. A second consecutive trip to the NCAA Playoffs and a trip long enough to require a plane flight to Waltham, Massachusetts.

Even Tepper wasn't prepared for what came next. First was approximately a five-inch snowfall that fell on the Boston suburb. With an artificial surface, Bentley Field was in perfect shape for the game, although temperatures in the mid-30s and a strong wind would factor into the contest. Second was a shootout that would leave the defensive strategist shaking his head.

The first half featured an incredible ebb and flow, with the score tied at 34-34 at intermission. The second quarter alone saw 47 points scored, with an average of one touchdown every two minutes. At one point the two teams lit the scoreboard on seven of eight possessions. The statistics were as incredible as the score. The two teams combined for 722 total yards. Bentley's standout quarterback, Marc Eddy, threw for 383 yards in the first 30 minutes.

When Bentley intercepted a pass and returned it for a touchdown on the first play of the second half, things didn't look good for the Fighting Scots, trailing for the first time, 41-34. But the Edinboro defense stepped up in the second half and limited the Falcons to just a third quarter field goal the rest of the half. Edinboro answered the Bentley interception return with a two-yard TD run by Matt Phillips to tie the score.

Edinboro scored the winning touch-down on a 23-yard pass from Justin Bouch to Nate Eimer with 5:26 to play. The Fighting Scots forced two more fumbles after that, but Bentley still had one final chance to score with just over two minutes remaining. The Falcons drove to the Edinboro 33, and it wasn't until a blitzing Brandon Banas harried Eddy into an incomplete pass on fourth down that the Fighting Scots could celebrate their first playoff win since 1990.


As luck would have it, it would be Banas who figured as the centerpiece in the second game, as well. While there was no snow in East Stroudsburg, a light rain and cool temperatures left the field slick, but the Warrior offense didn't seem to mind. Working behind Terwilliger, the PSAC East Player of the Year for the second straight season, Stroudsburg piled up 474 yards in total offense, but it was the final 29 that hurt the Scots the most.

Leading 32-29 with less than three minutes to play, Edinboro was forced to punt. Culver returned the punt 36 yards to the Edinboro 40. The Scot defense stiffened, and East Stroudsburg eventually faced a 4th-and-11 from the 29 with a minute to play. Pressured, Terwilliger threw up a prayer which was answered. As he was being hauled down from behind, the ball went through Banas' hands, hit his shoulder pad and bounced over his head, with Warrior wide receiver Evan Prall catching the ball while on his back at the 17.

East Stroudsburg had new life and four fresh downs, but the first three resulted in incomplete passes. After having three kicks blocked during the day, Stroudsburg head coach Denny Douds eschewed a game-tying field goal and instead went for it on 4th-and-10. Terwilliger scrambled free and hit Culver with a 17-yard TD pass with 22 seconds left.

Despite the loss, Edinboro enjoyed a record-tying and breaking season. The Fighting Scots have now recorded back-to-back 9-3 campaigns, tying the record for wins in a season and also matching the standard for victories in a two-year period.

Individually, Andre Burke shattered the single-season rushing record with 1,713 yards. He was well on his way to another big day when he suffered an injury late in the first quarter of the East Stroudsburg game and did not return. Justin Bouch passed for a season-record 2,281 yards, and his leading receiver, Justin Lipscomb, set a new season record for receptions with 53.
