






Foster F. Diebold, President Edinboro University of Pennsylvania

We often hear and read these days of the "global village." The term and all it portends has indeed become a reality on the Edinboro University campus. We have all become citizens of that village. Never was this more apparent than during the final months of last year. In November I traveled to Pakistan, a country with which Edinboro University and seven of its institutions have maintained formal academic linkage affiliations for a decade, to accept an honorary Doctor of Laws degree from the Governor of Sindh Province and chancellor of its universities. In December, Governor Haroon led an official delegation to Edinboro to join me in a splendid ceremony that recognized our past decade of relationships and the next decade of progress to come.

However, it was during my visit to the city of Islamabad that the true meaning of international education came into sharpest focus. And it was an Edinboro alumna who brought this realization. A young lady approached me at a reception and told me that she was the first Pakistani graduate of Edinboro University, having graduated in 1971, some 20 years ago. Hafeeza Bokhari is now a high official in the United Nations organization that has responsibility for the relocation of refugees from war-torn neighboring lands. It was a most pleasant social reunion, but on reflection, it was much more than that. It represented to me the focus of what Edinboro University is all about, not only for our domestic students, but also for our international component. The realization of Ms. Bokhari's human potential, along with thousands of others who have graduated during the past decades, brings into greater definition the true meaning of the word university.

It is my firm belief that if we are to achieve world peace during our lifetime, it will be through a mixing of our cultures, utilizing education and commerce. Full global understanding will come about through intellectual and cultural understanding, and in the final analysis, a better global understanding may be among the most significant accomplishments of Edinboro University as together we face a changing and shrinking world.

Excellence is a catchword we hear frequently today in education. In a search for excellence, our education system is currently being scrutinized and criticized, yet our system should not be taken lightly. We do very well for the most part, given all of the external pressures. While we might hear more about secondary education, our colleges and universities are also facing many of the same constraints and demands. The challenge facing both systems is retaining excellence in the face of these growing hurdles.

Beginning last spring, the Alumni Board of Directors began planning a long-range effort to improve its level of financial and educational support for Edinboro University. A special three-year effort aimed at increasing alumni scholarships kicked off under the direction of Annual Fund Chairman Frank Jakovac.

The Board is committed to returning increased funds to Edinboro students in the years to come. It's a big effort. We need to raise a minimum of an additional \$25,000 this year alone to get the first phase of the program moving. We can strengthen programs, attract first-rate students, and retain the best students with your gift to the Annual Fund.

Approximately 11 percent of Edinboro grads currently contribute to the Annual Fund Drive; our goal is to reach or exceed the national average of close to 20 percent. Jim Fisher: Ace Detective, Master Teacher



Jim Fisher is an anachronism. He is a throwback to an earlier time when people idolized their heroes and believed in truth and justice. He is part Sherlock Holmes, part Lone Ranger, and he just may be the best criminal justice investigator in the United States.

Since 1974 Fisher has been a professor of criminal justice at Edinboro University. After graduating from Vanderbilt University Law School in 1966 he became a special agent for the Federal Bureau of Investigation, serving for five years in Washington, D.C., St. Louis, Dallas, and San Angelo, Texas.

Fisher first entered the national spotlight in 1987 with the publication of *The Lindbergh Case*, a book many consider to be the definitive work on the kidnapping and murder of Charles A. Lindbergh, Jr., the son of the famous aviator. Fisher became interested in the case after seeing a 1982 documentary, "Who Killed The Lindbergh Baby?".

With a tenacity and a thoroughness that have become his trademarks, Fisher began to reconstruct the crime from the time the Lindbergh baby was snatched from his cradle until Bruno Richard Hauptmann, the man convicted of the "Crime of the Century," was sent to the electric chair in New Jersey.

Fisher made several trips to the New Jersey State Police archives in West Trenton, becoming the first serious researcher to have access to nearly 250,000 FBI and police documents on the crime. He examined dozens of pieces of physical evidence including the wooden ladder Hauptmann made and used in the kidnapping, the handwritten ransom notes and the ransom money.

Fisher made a point of visiting many of the sites associated with the case, including the Lindbergh estate near Hopewell, New Jersey where the crime was committed.



In a strange coincidence, Fisher's personal investigation of the 50-year-old crime unexpectedly led to his involvement in a current case. In recent years the Lindbergh home had become a halfway house for juvenile offenders. A few days before Fisher came to the house a fire broke out in what had been Col. Lindbergh's den. When he arrived, local authorities asked Fisher to help investigate the blaze. One of the resident juveniles was eventually charged with starting the fire.

Fisher also visited the scene of the trial at the courthouse in Flemmington, Hauptmann's house in the Bronx, the cemetery where he was arrested, and the site where the body of the Lindbergh baby was found. After four years of research, Fisher was convinced of Hauptmann's guilt.

Following the book's publication, Fisher found himself at the center of attention – and controversy. He appeared dozens of times on television and radio in New York, Philadelphia, Boston, Washington, Miami, Pittsburgh, and Cleveland. He was interviewed by Howard Cosell and Geraldo Rivera, and attacked by revisionists who were unyielding in their belief in Hauptmann's innocence. He met in face to face debate with one of his chief critics, Anthony Scadudo, a reporter for *Newsday* who wrote *Scapegoat*, a book which claims

Jim Fisher was born in the Brentwood area of Pittsburgh where he lived until he was six with his mother, father and younger sister – "a very ordinary middle class life."

When he was seven, the family moved to West Virginia where they were located for the next ten years.

"I played outdoors a good bit
– sandlot football and baseball.
But I didn't take to school."

When he was a junior, they moved to Erie where he went to an inner-city school with 400 in his class. This presented quite a culture shock for him.

Hauptmann was framed. The debate, which was held at the University of Delaware, was filmed for a PBS documentary on the Lindbergh story.



With the notable exception of Scadudo, who called Fisher's book "mortally flawed," literary critics were in high praise of his work. A reviewer in the New York Review of Books wrote, "If I had only one book to read on the Lindbergh case I should... choose Fisher's. It is balanced, impartial, and contains much material not to be found elsewhere." Cleveland Amory said, "Jim Fisher has written the definitive study of the most engrossing crime of this century. It is not only extraordinarily readable, but it is also compellingly authentic."

The book became part of the Lindbergh story itself. Anna Hauptmann, the 92-year-old widow of Richard, who tenaciously clings to her husband's innocence, said of Fisher's work: "That book – there are lies and lies in there," despite not having read it.

The notoriety Fisher brought to himself through his investigation of the Lindbergh case paid dividends in an unexpected way. Dozens of former law enforcement officers from that era contacted Fisher about their own exploits. As a result, Fisher began documenting the life and times of many unsung heroes from America's most colorful crime period. Among those he interviewed were Thomas McDade, the former FBI agent who

helped track down Ma Barker and Babyface Nelson; Fred Inbau, emeritus professor of law at Northwestern University who is perhaps the



nation's leading authority on the lie detector; and Donald Daud, a recognized expert on questioned documents and handwriting.

Because many of those Fisher interviewed were in their seventies and eighties, they were eager to tell their stories so they would be preserved. Some even gave Fisher personal possessions and memorabilia from their law enforcement careers. From that sprang the idea of establishing an archive of criminal justice history at Edinboro.

Early in 1989 Fisher and fellow Edinboro professor E. Ernest Wood were preparing a presentation on famous Western Pennsylvania crimes for the University's Academic Festival. They asked student Linda Wilson to look through the library's microfilm collection of newspapers from the 1950s for information on any famous murders. She discovered a clipping from the *Erie Times* in March of 1959 about an 11-year-old Allegheny County boy confessing to the 1956 murder of his mother.

Fisher was immediately skeptical. "Either the story was a misprint or a horrible miscarriage of justice."

The case concerned Helen Zubryd, a 41-year-old widow, brutally killed in the basement of her house with an ax. After more than two "In the summer before my senior year, my father got me a job as an industrial roofer. I realized I didn't want to be a blue-collar worker. I could see into the office windows from the roofs where I worked and noticed that everyone dressed well. I decided I would have to go to college."

He enrolled at Davis & Elkins College in West Virginia and became a journalism major. "I worked for the Randolph County Intermountain Daily and was paid 10 cents an inch. And I wrote lots of inches. I loved that job!"

During his sophomore year, Fisher transferred to Westminster College after his parents moved to New Wilmington, Pa. At this point, he says, he made a mistake: he changed his major to English. It was such a disaster that he quit college.



Fisher re-enrolled at Westminster and changed his major again—this time to political science. There he came to know Dr. Charles Edwards, professor of political science, and says, "For the first time in my life I saw someone I wanted to be like. After I graduated in 1963 Dr. Edwards got me into Vanderbilt University Law School in Nashville."

When he left Vanderbilt, he was hired by the FBI and was sent to St. Louis. From there he and his wife, Sue, and their daughter, Leslie, were sent to San Angelo, Texas, where Debra was born. Son Jim arrived while they were living in Dallas.

In 1972, Fisher and his family moved back to Erie where he began teaching at Mercyhurst College. Two years later, he joined the faculty at Edinboro University. * years of investigation and interviewing hundreds of people, county homicide detectives accused Charles Zubryd of his mother's murder. Because he was so young, Charles was never tried for the crime. Instead, after his relatives abandoned him, he was adopted by industrial psychologist Frank Duffy. Charles, now referring to himself as Chuck, took on his adopted name, grew up, and moved to Columbus, Ohio, all the while believing he may have killed his mother.

That belief shattered dramatically on Easter weekend, 1989 when Duffy answered the telephone at his place of business in Columbus. "I have evidence," said the caller, "that you did not kill your mother."

The caller was Fisher. In the weeks since discovering the case, he had tracked down the autopsy report, crime lab reports and other vital documents stored in archives in the University of Pittsburgh's Hillman Library. Now there was no doubt in Fisher's mind: Duffy was innocent.

During his 15-month investigation Fisher uncovered another 1950s murder case with some close similarities to the Zubryd murder. The same county detective who had accused Duffy, pressured 13-year-old Jerry Pacek into confessing to the murder of 52-year-old Lillian Stevick. Unlike Duffy, Pacek was tried and found guilty, becoming the youngest person ever convicted of murder in Pennsyl-

vania. He served ten years at Camp Hill prison and ten more on probation.

But, like the Duffy case, Fisher's analysis of the evidence convinced him Pacek was innocent. He took his findings to the Allegheny County District Attorney, Robert Colville, who reopened the 30-year-old case. When he, too, became convinced of Pacek's innocence, Colville wrote a letter to Governor Robert P. Casey and the Pennsylvania Board of Pardons recommending Pacek receive a full pardon.

On September 12, 1991, Fisher, acting as Pacek's representative, went before the Board of Pardons in Harrisburg to plead for Pacek's pardon. He had already prepared a 300-page report for the board that documented his position with court records, crime lab reports, and crime scene photographs. Fisher, speaking to a packed hearing room, was given 15 minutes to present his case. All of his years spent in law school, the FBI, and in teaching criminal justice culminated in that crowded room as the nation watched.

Within moments of the conclusion of his remarks, the board made an unprecedented decision. For the first time in the history of Pennsylvania it voted unanimously to recommend a full pardon for a person who had been convicted of murder.

People in the room applauded. Others openly wept. Pacek hugged his wife and said, "I feel I have finally gotten justice from the system." For Fisher, it was his finest moment in a 25-year criminal justice career.

"When the Board recommended Pacek for a pardon, I felt like I had been preparing my whole life for that moment," said Fisher. "It was something that gave meaning to my life, my career. I have a law degree but I'm not a lawyer. I'm a college professor, but I don't feel like a scholar. I'm an investigator but not a cop. I'm just a guy who got Chuck Duffy and Jerry Pacek off the hook, and that's good enough for me."

Steve Korpa Honored by Disney Channel

Steve Korpa teaches more than art – he teaches life. The 1963 graduate of Edinboro has been forging lives as well as metal craft at Pittsburgh's Carrick High School since 1969. On November 24 Korpa was honored by the Disney Channel as one of the top 36 teachers in the United States in a live broadcast of "Walt Disney Company Presents the American Teacher Awards." He was one of only three visual arts teachers chosen from among hundreds of teachers all across the country.

Korpa, who specializes in metal and jewelry, teaches a philosophy as well as a craft. "I tell my students, 'see it in your mind, get it in your life. If you can dream it, you can do it."

Using a formula called GPAR – goal, plan, action, result – he tells his students to start at the ending – see the final product in their minds, visualize what they want. Then develop a plan, take action, and check the results. "If they don't like the results then I tell them to develop another plan," said Korpa. "There are no failures, only unsuccessful experiments."

In Korpa's words, he is in the business of making the metaphysical physical. He uses the process of creating a small work of art as a metaphor for the process of creating one's own life.

Korpa grew up in Pittsburgh and attended Carrick High School. His art teacher, Donn Kurschbaumer, knew of Korpa's interest in art and encouraged him to apply at Edinboro. "I loved the place," said Korpa. "When I walked into Loveland Hall it was like walking into a miniature Carrick High School."

He believes his personal recognition must also be shared with Edinboro. "It's part of me. My success cannot be separated from Edinboro."

Upon graduating in 1963, he started teaching at Overbrook Elementary School, just down the hill from Carrick. In the summers of 1965 and 1966, Korpa went to Italy to study at the University of Florence.

He was overwhelmed by the beauty of the city where Michelangelo lived and worked. Not only did it change his life, it changed the way he looked at life.

In 1969 he began teaching at Carrick High School and has been there for 22 years. His most trying time as a teacher came in February of 1988 when a student committed suicide. Within a few days another suicide followed and five others were attempted. The stunned Carrick teachers were desperate for solutions to break the string of suicides.

Korpa's students had been making kaleidoscopes in class. He proposed taking one of the copper tubes and putting in it photos and letters from the mourning students. With the approval of the principal and a psychologist, and permission from the family of one of the deceased students, they buried the tube at the student's gravesite. There were no more suicide attempts.

For his efforts Korpa was one of only ten teachers honored by *Reader's Digest* in 1989 as an American Hero in Education, because he "gives us reason to feel hopeful about the future of our nation." The magazine's award brought a \$10,000 grant to Carrick High School.

The American Federation of Teachers nominated him for the Dis-

ney award, and his principal, Brian White, wrote a letter of recommendation. In April of 1991 Disney notified Korpa that he was one of 36 selected for this year's awards. Disney flew Korpa and his wife, Dottie, to Disney World in September where they and the other teachers received the red carpet treatment from Disney president Michael Eisner. Korpa said the experience was like being transported to another planet. "I was in great company," he said. "We made an absolutely wonderful faculty."

Korpa is delighted to be a teacher. He said he was able to resolve the conflict between being a teacher or being an artist. "Art teaches the ability to create – for students to create their own good life. It's something that can be applied throughout their life. My artwork was my teaching. It exists in the minds of my students. Teachers are immortal because their gifts are the gifts of the mind and spirit."

Dottie is a nursery school teacher in Pittsburgh. Their son, Jason, will follow in his father's footsteps and enroll at Edinboro in the fall of 1992. Their daughter, Jennifer, is a sophomore in high school. Korpa was one of seven Edinboro University graduates named distinguished alumni at the Alumni Association's 1990 Reunion Weekend.

Dick Houston: A Lifelong Love Affair with Africa



Most people, if asked, would be able to pick one or two places around the world that they have always dreamed of visiting, but never did. However, for Richard E. Houston, an alumnus of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania, it can be said that he has fulfilled his dream.

Houston's desire to see and experience the adventure Africa can provide began when he was growing up in the 1950s. While in the first grade, he made many trips to the Bula Theater in Ashtabula, Ohio. There, scenes of Africa filled his young mind with a desire for adventure. He was always first in line at the theater to see such movies as King Solomon's Mines, The African Queen, and Mogambo. He also watched Martin and Osa Johnson films, read Tarzan comics, and anything else he could get his hands on. During his teen years, his desire for Africa was further stirred by the lions and elephants brought to town by the circus.

After graduating from Ashtabula High School, he entered Kent State University and graduated in 1965. He then went on to earn his master's degree in secondary education from Edinboro University in 1969.

People often let go of childhood dreams when the responsibilities of adult life become dominant, but not so for Houston. He first taught English at Wallace Braden Junior High in Braden, Ohio, and later at Ashtabula High. Eventually he moved to Maracaibo, Venezuela, for three years, where he was a teacher employed by the Standard Oil Company.

During those early years, he would tell all of his students about Africa. However, his talk began to turn into action after being confronted with a challenging question from a junior high student: "If you are so in love with Africa in books and films, why don't you stop talking about it and start doing something about getting there?" Well, he did,



and by June of 1972, after having scrimped on his teacher's salary, he was ready to leave for Africa.

Since then, he has been a teacher at the American Embassy School in Lusaka, Zambia. His stationing there has allowed the dreams of a lifetime to come true. Shortly after his arrival, he met a British man who was looking for a partner to start a safari business. That was nearly 20 years ago, and Houston has been on safari ever since.

"Africa to me is more of a 'feeling' than a place," Houston said. "It's a great place for writers and has been that way since Hemingway gave it the 'feel' of time and place." Houston said that there is always an almost indefinable electricity in the air in Africa: "The same sense of electricity created by the stage presence of great performers such as Frank Sinatra and Judy Garland and Tony Bennett."

Houston is currently back in the U.S. in connection with the recent publication of his book, *Safari Adventure*, which chronicles the events of a one-month safari he led some two years ago. It is his first book, though he plans a second which he describes as a "combination of anecdotes and a cookbook." Perhaps he'll reveal the culinary secrets that go into his


favorite safari meal – spaghetti; peanut butter cups are a close second.

Houston's reminiscences of 20 years of African travel and adventure add up to an array of some pretty powerful tales, but two vignettes stand out. The first was his climb to the top of Mt. Kilimanjaro. "My God, I'm here!" was his reaction.

The second was his trek to the northern frontier of Kenya. "The nomads haven't changed there in centuries. The scenery is monumental yet very welcoming. The land is so real and untouched and the game herds are fabulous. And there's an ancient civility in the natives . . . there's nothing we have that they want . . . they're not impressed.

"Overall, the place is magic," Houston said. "The nomads accept their identity and place in life."

Houston said and writes often that Edinboro University has always been a special place to him, a place that he has looked back upon with nostalgia. He credits his former Edinboro English professor, Jack Tohtz (now retired) – a man Houston still describes as a truly great teacher and after whom he mirrored his own teaching style – as having been the one who gave him "inspiration, encouragement, and a love for the English language."







When one thinks of the wineries and vineyards of America, chances are the wine-producing regions of California or New York come to mind. But some of the best wines in the country can be found at Conneaut Cellars Winery, located in a modest one-story building beside an abandoned railroad right-of-way in the resort town of Conneaut Lake, Pennsylvania.


Created less than ten years ago, Conneaut Cellars started as a hobby by its owner, Dr. Alan Wolf, a former teacher, counter-intelligence agent and State Department officer. "It was a hobby that grew and grew," said Wolf.

After graduating from Edinboro University of Pennsylvania in 1951 with degrees in English and social studies, Wolf served in the Army in the Korean War as a paratrooper and in the Army's Counter-Intelligence Corps. In 1955 he joined the State Department and was assigned to Germany as a security officer to screen refugees crossing the border from eastern Europe into Germany.

The U.S. was interested in bringing the best scientists and technicians back to America. Wolf's job was to identify them and help them find work while waiting for permission to immigrate to the U.S. At a time when jobs were scarce in post-war Europe, Wolf was able to find work for biochemists at area wineries.

Because of his position, Wolf visited many wineries, and it was there that he learned the basics of winemaking. "I got interested in the biochemistry," said Wolf.

After three years he left the State Department and returned to the Meadville area to teach in the Conneaut School District. In 1968 he joined the Millcreek School District, and in 1970 he went to the Northwest Tri-County Intermediate Unit where he became assistant executive director.

Wolf's dream of operating his own winery got a big boost in 1968 when Pennsylvania loosened its grip on the alcohol industry by allowing wineries to sell directly to consumers as well as permitting the dispensing of free samples, Sunday sales and the use of credit cards. In return, wineries were required to stay small and use only fruit grown in Pennsylvania.

Wolf formed a limited partnership with a group of investors in 1981, with the idea of building a 7,000-gallon winery. In 1982 the company was bonded, and in 1983 Conneaut Cellars Winery sold its first bottle.

Today the winery produces 15 different varieties of white, rosé, and red wines, each of which has won some sort of medal. The Cabernet Sauvignon won a silver medal this year in international competition against French, German, and Italian wines, and a gold medal as the best wine of its variety in Pennsylvania. The Chardonnay also won a medal this year.

When asked what his best wine is, Wolf replied, "The best wine in the world is the one the customer likes."

He explained there are at least four things a good wine must have –

a nice appearance, balance, and a recognizable aroma and taste. "There is so little research on taste," said Wolf. "Much of what we call taste is ambiance."

Wolf names his wines either for the grapes from which they are made, or for a location in Crawford County. Wolf Island, a semi-dry white wine is named for the largest island in Conneaut Lake. Pymatuning Rose is a slightly sweet rosé wine named for Pymatuning Lake. Colonel Crawford, for whom the county is named, is a semi-sweet red wine. With a bit of tongue-in-cheek, Wolf says the wine goes very well with steaks and barbecues. (The real Colonel Crawford was burned at the stake by Indians.)

Wolf's primary duty is that of winemaker. It's his responsibility to test the wines for quality and decide when the fermenting process is finished. The winery now has 15,000 gallons in both stainless steel and oak barrels, and uses only grapes produced by a handful of growers along the Lake Erie shore.

Wolf's memories of his Edinboro experience remain fond ones, but never have they been quite as vivid as when he was first assigned to duties with the State Department.

"Back in those days, the Ivy Leaguers and a few assorted Stanford grads had a lock on State Department jobs," Wolf said. "I couldn't figure out how someone from a state teachers college in northwestern Pennsylvania landed a position with that crowd."

One day in a casual conversation, one of his co-workers let slip that everyone was under the impression that Wolf's degree was from a prestigious European institution – Edinburgh University in Scotland.

"I never let on otherwise," Wolf said, "but to this day I've always believed that the education I got at Edinboro was as good as any others I saw, and it made me as competitive in that workplace as anyone else."

Doll-Making Hobby Becomes Career



Nerissa Shaub's home and studio are littered with body parts. Arms, legs and heads are scattered on the tables and chairs. But it is not a gruesome sight, because Shaub is a master at putting all the pieces together into beautiful, lifelike dolls.

Shaub's dolls – made of fabric, clay, wax or cernit – are adorned with real hair, detailed clothing and handpainted features. They can retail for as much as \$8,000. Sold throughout the United States, Germany, and England, several of her creations have also found homes in Japan. A store owner in Alaska told her the dolls are popular with Japanese tourists.

Shaub received her undergraduate degree in fine arts and her MFA in weaving with a ceramics minor at Edinboro University. Until this year, she was a member of the applied human ecology department at Bowling Green State University teaching interior design classes by day and making a name for herself in the doll industry in her spare time.

Finding it difficult to keep up with the demand, Shaub left Bowling Green earlier this year to open a studio and business in Boulder, Colorado, where her family lives. "Teaching was great and my department was really wonderful to me," Shaub said. "Working there gave me the freedom to experiment with my artwork and still earn a living. I really liked teaching, but I'm also very passionate about my doll work and one of me had to go."

She has contracts with doll manufacturers who make copies of her originally-designed dolls and produce limited editions. Others she makes in her studio herself, experimenting with sizes, colors and materials.

As a way of combining her talents, Shaub began experimenting



with statue-like animals dressed in clothes. "They were leather on top of ceramic with movable arms," she said. "I even wove a coat for one of them. No one else was working the way I was, and I made about 40 of them in a five-year period. At that time, they sold in the art market. Now they are more in the doll market."

After the animal dolls, she began working with wax over porcelain, producing very fragile and realistic-looking dolls. She learned the method by talking to other artists, reading books, and experimenting.

"I spent a whole summer and fall working with the wax," she said. "I had problems melting it properly, and also if it gets cold it will fall off the porcelain. But when it works, it looks like real flesh."

She later turned to cernit, a thermal-set plastic that gives a wax-like quality but can be sculpted like clay. Once she felt comfortable with the medium, she began using it to make portrait dolls, which are doll versions of actual people. She's made one of her daughter, Rachael, and others of sons and daughters of friends. She even made one of herself copied from a photo of when she was five.

"In a way, making the doll of myself was very therapeutic," Shaub said. "I was forced to envision the child in myself, a memory that was starting to disappear. I think it was good for me to bring that back." Shaub admits she has a short attention span which causes her to move on to another project as soon as she has mastered one medium. Recently she began working in three dimensions. She collects pictures of old paintings which feature children, makes dolls from them, and then creates a backdrop. The dolls are positioned on a baseboard with a wall behind them that Shaub hand paints to create the same environment as the

picture.

"I get my ideas from cards and prints, and there's no copyright problem as long as the picture is more than 75 years old," Shaub said. "I made one recently that was advertised and sold immediately. A woman saw it and said she had to have it because it was from her favorite print."

In making a doll, Shaub often will sketch a picture of it first. She then free molds the parts, which are cleaned and fired. Depending on the type she is making, they are either dipped in wax, painted or coated with cernit. The parts are attached to a fabric body and the details painted on.

Sometimes she uses glass eyes, other times she paints the doll's face. Shaub tries to use real hair as much as possible for a more realistic effect. It takes approximately 30 hours to make a 14" doll from start to finish.

As Shaub looks to the future, she doesn't see just dolls. She said she would like to get back into fabric and interior design, and perhaps experiment with designing furniture.

"I just really like new challenges. I enjoy learning different things so I don't feel like a factory," she said.
"What is nice about it is that I never know what I will be doing from one month to the next."

Fall Phonathon Reaches New Heights

Edinboro University alumni enthusiastically supported the 1991 Annual Fund Fall Phonathon for scholarships with over \$61,000 in pledges. Of the 5,788 alumni contacted, 2,339 made pledges, which translates to a 40.4 percent participation rate. Although the emphasis for this phonathon was on contacting previous donors, 1,382 alumni non-donors were contacted, and 224, or 16.2 percent, pledged. A record 588 increased gifts were made overall.

In February, student callers will contact those past donors who have not yet made their annual gift, and will attempt to reach Edinboro graduates who have not yet made a gift to the school.

"Alumni across the country are realizing more than ever the importance of supporting their alma mater with personal contributions," said David Sheneman '64, president of the Alumni Association's Board of Directors. "That support is as important for state-owned institutions as for pri-

vate colleges and universities. State support for public schools is dwindling and ever-increasing needs demand attention. Unfortunately, tuition alone can't solve the problem of shortfalls, and schools are reluctant to increase tuition, as increases place additional burdens on their students."

Recognizing this need for increased support from alumni and the challenge to provide quality educational services while keeping tuition costs reasonable, the Edinboro University Alumni Association Board of Directors voted this year in an unprecedented move to channel Annual Fund monies into student scholarships.

"Alumni endorsement for this project has been rewarding and overwhelming," said Annual Fund Chairman Frank Jakovac '73. "At this time we believe we can reach this year's goal of \$125,000 for alumni support for the Annual Fund."

Employees Back Scholarship Plan

With the aim of easing the increasing financial burden for students, Edinboro University employees will devote the 1991-92 Annual Fund to the support of student scholarships. Along with the alumni and parent constituencies, employees are committed to the goal of increasing support for the Edinboro Scholarship Endowment Fund.

This year's alumni theme, "Scholarships for Today and Tomorrow," as announced in early August by Frank J. Jakovac Jr. '73, Alumni Association Annual Fund Chairman, and David Sheneman '64, president of the Alumni Association Board of Directors, was strongly endorsed by the employee campaign leadership.

The University has appointed three co-chairs for the employee campaign: Dr. Roy Strausbaugh, Ted Atkinson, and Judy Kellogg. The co-chairs said employee contributions will be used to help eligible students and their families who are facing rising tuition costs and cutbacks in state and federal support. "For many of

Commencement December 15, 1991

For the first time since 1975, Edinboro University of Pennsylvania held a winter commencement ceremony to honor those students who completed degree requirements in August or December, 1991.

Six hundred fifty-two students graduated with associate, bachelor's and master's degrees. Among them were 16 students who graduated Summa Cum Laude; 18 Magna Cum Laude; and 39 Cum Laude. In addition, four students graduated as members of the University's Honors Program.

Carrying the Ceremonial Mace and leading the academic procession as University Marshal was Dr. Robert Connors, professor of elementary education. During his distinguished 33-year career at Edinboro, Connors served in the departments of social studies, geography and elementary education and spent 16 years as chairman of the elementary education department.

Three-time Academy Award-winning animation director Chuck Jones was presented an honorary degree, Doctor of Letters, honoris causa, at the ceremony. For more than 50 years, Jones has delighted

audiences with his ability to bring life to such characters as Pepe le Pew, Bugs Bunny, Daffy Duck, Elmer Fudd, Wile E. Coyote, and the Roadrunner.

Following 30 years with Warner Brothers, Jones joined MGM to work on Tom and Jerry and won an Academy Award for a short called *The Dot and the Line*. He later set up Chuck Jones Enterprises and produced television specials including *A Cricket in Times Square*, *A Very Merry Cricket*, and *Yankee Doodle Cricket*. He also worked on the TV versions of *Horton Hears a Who* and *How the Grinch Stole Christmas*.

In addition to his films, Jones has authored six children's books and is currently working on an animation technique textbook.

Associate Vice President Appointed

Dr. Michelle R. Howard-Vital has been named associate vice president for academic programs and dean of the University College at Edinboro. Prior to joining the staff, Howard-Vital was dean of continuing education and non-traditional programs at Chicago State University. In her new position, she will work with Dr. John Fleischauer, provost and vice president for academic affairs, in the areas of academic programs and budgets, articulation agreements with two-year colleges, and Middle States accreditation. As dean of the newly-created University College, she will oversee academic support services, the center for advising and career services, a new learning center, opportunity college, and the internship program.

Howard-Vital received bachelor's and master's degrees in English literature and language from the University of Chicago, and a doctorate in public policy analysis, specializing in education, from the University of Illinois at Chicago.

Edinboro History Being Updated

Dr. Roy Strausbaugh, dean of academic administration, is writing a contemporary history of Edinboro University of Pennsylvania, 1970-1991. The book follows *A Portrait of Edinboro*, written by former history professor Russell Vance, which covered the first 100 years of the school, 1876-1976. Strausbaugh's work will detail the growth of Edinboro and its curriculum, enrollment, faculty and infrastructure. It will compare and contrast Edinboro's activities with the general trends in American public higher education.

The book is expected to cover public policy issues, Edinboro's response to the Commonwealth's vision of the state-owned institutions, the arrival of President Foster Diebold, Edinboro's role as a regional resource, presidential leadership, the growing diversity of the student body, the creation of the State System of Higher Education, the increase in non-traditional students, budgetary constraints, and the introduction of collective bargaining.

Edinboro's Late, Great Sox Harrison Again a Hall of Famer



Benjamin Regis "Sox" Harrison, who was both the cornerstone and keystone of Edinboro athletics, was inducted posthumously into the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame at the Metropolitan Erie Chapter's recent sixth annual induction banquet.

Known by five decades of Edinboro students as the Knute Rockne of Edinboro sports, Harrison came to what was then Edinboro State Normal School in 1919 and formed and coached its first football team. He served as athletic director, physical education instructor, and coach of literally every sport at Edinboro until his retirement 34 years later in 1952.

When Edinboro's football stadium was built in 1965, it was named in Sox Harrison's honor, and he was the first person inducted into the Edinboro University Athletic Hall of Fame when it was founded in 1982.

The Pittsburgh native was himself an outstanding athlete, playing professional football and baseball for several teams in and around Buffalo. Along the way in his long and distinguished career, he befriended many legendary sports figures, among them Jim Thorpe, Pop Warner, Connie Mack and famed baseball manager Joe McCarthy. It was McCarthy, Harrison's one-time college roommate, who gave him the nickname

"Sox" after Louis Socksalexis, an Indian ballplayer who inspired the nickname for baseball's Cleveland Indians.

In 1938, Sox founded the Sunset Camps on Edinboro Lake, a program of summer camps for boys and girls which was the first of its kind in the United States. His retirement from Edinboro in 1952 only meant more time to devote to teaching the camp's many activities which ranged from water sports to archery, tennis, soccer, and even "good manners," as Sox often said. He directed the camps until 1962.

Former Edinboro dean of men, James Harrison, Sox's son, accepted the Hall of Fame plaque at the induction ceremonies. Jim was accompanied by his wife, Shirley Swift Harrison, ESTC '40.

Erie's chapter of the Pennsylvania Sports Hall of Fame is one of 29 throughout the Commonwealth. The 6,000 members statewide perpetuate the memory of athletes and others who have brought fame and recognition to Pennsylvania. •

Diebold Awarded Doctorate by Government of Pakistan

Edinboro President Foster F.
Diebold has been honored by the
government and universities of Pakistan. In a November 12 ceremony
held at the Governor's House in the
city of Karachi, Province of Sindh,
Diebold was awarded the honorary
degree, Doctor of Laws, honoris causa,
by the governor of the Province as
Chancellor of the University of
Sindh, Mr. Mahmoud A. Haroon.
One of only a very small number of
honorary degrees ever awarded, it
was the first conferment of a doctorate by Pakistan to an American.

The citation accompanying the degree commends Diebold for "meritorious services rendered . . . toward the cause of higher education in Pakistan." Continuing, the citation recognizes Diebold's qualities of leadership in the field of higher education, his public service as an "adviser for human values," his contribution in civic life for the world community, and "his articulate insistence on ethical standards in the administration of public education and his effective role for the people of Pakistan in general and the universities of Pakistan in particular."

A degree conferred by a provincial governor, acting in the capacity of a university chancellor, is recognized as an award from the Government of Pakistan. The special convocation at the Governor's House in which the doctorate was conferred was conducted with both the academic and military precision typical to the Pakistanis.

Governor Haroon expressed his hope that both Edinboro and the Pakistani universities with which it is linked will benefit from programs and projects to be undertaken through the increased levels of relationships. •



Men Swimmers Look for Top 20 National Ranking

The Edinboro University swimming program, under the direction of coach Paul Stamm, has made a steady progression toward the national spotlight over the past two years.

The 1991-92 men's team will feature numerous potential All Americans, with team goals set on improving their 14th place finish at last season's NCAA Division II national championships.

Returning to anchor the team will be a trio of All Americans in Rune Christensen, Ted Erdos and Dave Lechner. The threesome helped last year's 800 yard free relay squad attain national recognition, while Christensen was an individual All American two years ago. Christensen and Erdos specialize in distance races and will also look to climb in the PSAC championships. Lechner, just a sophomore, is expected to challenge for state titles in the 50,100 and 200-yard freestyle events.

Other key performers include senior co-captains Ed Cercone and Lance Bezek and backstrokers Dave Baker and J.R. Jenson. Cercone has been one of the school's top sprint freestyle racers over his career, while Bezek is Edinboro's top backstroker, placing 4th in the 100 at the 1990-91

PSAC championships. Baker is a returning national qualifier in the 100 and 200-yard breast st roke events, while Jenson returns after a year off from competition.

Coach Stamm is quick to note the key to this year's team. "Talent cannot take our team to the top 10. It will be the desire to nurture this talent that will help us achieve these goals and that is the challenge ahead for our coaching staff."

Lady Scot Tankers Eye Division II Elite

If the 1991-92 edition of the Edinboro University women's swimming squad is to improve on last year's NCAA II finish, it will once again have to attain a "best season ever" showing.

Last season, the squad cracked Division II's top 10, and this year, the team eyes a higher finish. With four returning All Americans and a solid group of potential national finishers, coach Stamm is eager for the season to roll into the later months.

"If all the pieces fall into place and we can stay healthy, we can finish among the best in the country," Stamm comments. "The women have progressed at a very impressive pace and they know what is ahead for them."

Leading the list of returnees is six-event All American Kara Hopkins. The 1990 PSAC "Scholar-Athlete of the Year" continues to excel in and out of the classroom. Currently pursuing her master's degree, Hopkins was recently named All-PSAC in volleyball for 1991 and is destined for the Division II swim national championships in March. Hopkins has the potential to make a run at the individual national championship in her specialty, the 100-yard freestyle. The two-sport performer was the Edinboro female Athlete of the Year in 1990.


Also leading the squad will be team captains Tracy Tokanas and Shannon Schirack. Tokanas is a school record holder in two events while Schirack is a five-time All American and twice has earned Academic All American awards. Schirack also excels for the Lady Scot volleyball team.

Key returnees also include Christine Shilkunas, four-event school record holder Jill Kirby, Georgeann Kostrubanic, and All American Gretchen Jenson. Shilkunas adds strength after a year off, while Kirby will challenge for the PSAC individual title in the distance events. Kostrubanic holds three Edinboro records while Jenson adds depth to a strong field of freestylers.

"Our success on the conference and national levels will depend on the efforts of the people we have returning," Stamm comments. "The girls know that they can perform. They now have to reach back and prove to themselves just how good they can be at the national level."



Athletes Nominated for NCAA Post-Graduate and NCAA Honors

Two Edinboro University student-athletes were recently nominated for prestigious NCAA Scholarship awards given annually to the nation's top athletes and scholars.

Football's Walter Spisak was nominated for the NCAA Post-Graduate Scholarship Award, while Jodi Ensman of the women's volleyball squad was nominated for the NCAA Honors program honoring the nation's elite.

Both Edinboro University and Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference Scholar-Athletes, the pair recently demonstrated their skills for two very successful teams in 1991. Spisak, a 3.03 student, recently completed an All-Conference year as the Scots' starting tackle, while Ensman, at 3.4, was a three-year starter for the Lady Scot volleyballers. Spisak was a member of two NCAA playoff teams during his career, and Ensman helped lead the Lady Scots to a pair of PSAC titles and one runner-up honor.

Spisak helped lead the football team to a 7-4 record and was part of the starting offensive line for three years. Also an All American nominee, Spisak majors in art education and is considering graduate school upon graduation this spring. He captained the '91 Fighting Scots, a solid team that spent most of the season nationally ranked, and received high praise from four-year head football coach Tom Hollman.

Ensman, considered by many as the school's best defensive player ever, helped lead the Lady Scot volleyball team to an impressive 84-21 mark over the past two years. A health and physical education major, Ensman captained the squad for two years and led the team in digs. Considered the team's leader, she holds several school records and gets nothing but smiles from veteran coach Glen Conley.

"Jodi epitomizes the student-athlete concept. She handles everything very well and performs at the top of her game, no matter what the situation. She went after her classwork with the same drive she did her opponents for her entire career," said Conley.

Scot Runner Wins National Title; Men Finish in 9th Place, Women in 8th

Edinboro University freshman Martin Lyons of Australia recently captured the individual title at the NCAA Division II national championships held in Evansville, Illinois. The first-year performer outdistanced his nearest competitor by eight seconds to claim the national honor.

After winning the Pennsylvania State Athletic Conference and Eastern Regional individual crowns, Lyons proved he could "win it all" with his outstanding effort in Evansville. He covered the 10 kilometer distance in 31 minutes, 29 seconds for the gold medal placing. "He did it with such ease," commented veteran coach Doug Watts. "He may not be the most talented runner that Edinboro has ever produced but he may be the smartest. He knew what he had to do to win and he outfoxed the field to take first. Truly, a great accomplishment for this young man."

Lyons' effort sparked the men to a ninth-place team finish at the national championships as the Scots defended their '90 national team title. Edinboro has now won four of the past six NCAA II team national championships. Also running well for the Scots was Patrick Brady (42nd), Chris Moore (53rd), Tony Knapp (55th) and Fabian Uquillas (65th).

The Lady Scots, fresh off their team titles at states and East Regionals, took eighth overall to match their finish of a year ago. Freshman Roberta Raszkowski led the team with her 16th place finish to earn All American honors. The first-year runner is from nearby North East, Pennsylvania. Rounding out the women's top 10 team was Mariann Eckendorf, who took 26th at nationals, Audra Naujokas (41st), Kim Long (45th) and Deborah Springer (46th).


