

Original Play To Be Presented Tonight

An original play, THE EMBEZZLER, by Harry Sisak, will be featured among those presented tonight at 7:30 in Price Auditorium as part of the Spring Drama Workshop program. Sisak, a junior elementary major from Lock Haven, has been active in college dramatics since entering Lock Haven State College. He has had lead roles in many major productions and is now serving as president of Alpha Psi Omega, national honorary dramatics fraternity. Sisak also fills the unlimited position on the college wrestling squad.

Directing THE EMBEZZLER is Rodney Fowler, junior elementary major from Lock Haven. Fowler has played lead roles in DEATH OF A SALESMAN, TEN LITTLE INDIANS, A GAME OF CHESS, and MR. DEATH AND THE RED-HEADED WOMAN. He is a member of Alpha Psi Omega, president of the Council for Exceptional Children, and editor of THE EAGLE EYE. James Salmond, junior Social Science major from Altoona, Walt Rudder, junior English major from Philadelphia, and Melvin Hodes, sophomore elementary

major from Lock Haven, will assume the acting roles in this production. Both Salmond and Rudder are also members of Alpha Psi Omega. Salmond has appeared in TEN LITTLE INDIANS, THE BROWNING VERSION, and A GAME OF CHESS. Rudder has appeared in TEN LITTLE INDIANS, 27 WAGON LOADS OF COTTON, and THURBER'S CARNIVAL.

Harrison Hamlin, sophomore English major from Media, is directing THE HAPPY JOURNEY. Hamlin has appeared in TEN LITTLE INDIANS, THURBER'S CARNIVAL, DEATH OF A SALESMAN, and numerous one-act plays. Alpha Psi Omega

A **Thurber Carnival** is being presented through the efforts of Lock Haven State College's **Theta Zeta Cast of Alpha Psi Omega**.

Alpha Psi Omega was founded in 1925 as a national honor society for the college theatre. It is the largest recognition society in any departmental field. Three hundred and seventy colleges in the United States have chapters of **Alpha Psi Omega**. Pennsylvania is the leading state with thirty chapters.

Theta Zeta Cast was organized on our campus and chartered on December 1, 1941. The purpose of the organization is to give college students adequate recognition for their work in the theatre in the same way that students in other departments are honored. Alpha Psi Omega sets a goal for all workers of the college theatre; membership is by invitation to those students who have proven their abilities as actors, directors, costumers, scene designers and a host of skills and crafts that are a part of the theatre. At Lock Haven State, membership in **Alpha Psi Omega** is not to be considered the ultimate in the college actor's career; the stress is placed on devotion to the art of the theatre.

Nationally, **Alpha Psi Omega** has kept pace with the tremendous development of the educational theatre, and has spread "footlights across America" from New England to the new states of Alaska and Hawaii. In many communities the educational theatre is the only live theatre, and its program has now been expanded to include productions of standard modern and classical plays, children's theatre and musical theatre. Several American colleges now have departments of ballet, and thus include dance drama.

Educationally, **Alpha Psi Omega** members, if denied work in the professional theatre, may go armed with a degree and a solid background in theatre training and easily secure employment in the educational theatre as directors, technicians, and teachers of acting and theatre arts. The supply of these college trained people has a long way to go to catch up with the demand.


