Pros. Stephen Haynes (Scenic Design/Technical Director)..... Professor Haynes received his MFA in Design/Tech from Louisiana State University. Director's Notes

The well known and oft quoted philosopher Michelle Foucault said of William Shakespeare's *A MIDSUMMER NIGHT'S DREAM* "...it epitomizes and encourages our deepest and most lustful desire, to become transported by the intoxicant of love with the full confidence that someone or something other than ourselves is in control." Perhaps he is right...perhaps we do want to spare ourselves of any responsibility in the act of loving; perhaps we do want to divest ourselves of any culpable participation in our own lustful realities. Or, perhaps, in showing us ourselves, Shakespeare gives us the opportunity to confront, embrace and actively deal with our deepest desires. We have decided to set this production in the "Roaring 20's," in a time where two worlds existed at once. In this era of prohibition, we lived by day in world that "just said no" to alcohol and jazz. But, by night, we entered the underworld, the world of the SPEAKEASY, a world full of jazz and liquor and dancing; a world made all that more enticing by its prohibition. Maybe, just maybe, if we expose the "underworld," if we choose to embrace our hidden realities, if we choose to understand "Fairies" not as something that controls us (like a rogue government or some powerful diplomatic machine) but as something that we produce, as something that we control, as something that finally gives us our true love...then maybe, just maybe...we can dream into existence a world of peace, a world where all women can disobey their fathers and choose their own husbands, a world where marriage is forged in the light of love and not simply for the love of law...a world where wars fought for the sake of "underground fairies" is no more.

About the Department of Performing Arts, Theatre Division

The Bachelor of Arts degree in Theatre combines a liberal arts education with practical theatre production experience. Students study drama theory and forms of theatrical productions from a historical and contemporary approach. Not only do students study acting technique, scenic, lighting costume and stage make-up design, they also have opportunities in directing, dance and improvisational theatre. To provide students with ample hands-on experience, the academic program is coupled with the practical experience component in all of the collaborative roles associated with a theatre production.

Outside the class environment, students may participate in activities such as the University Players, the student drama organization, which produces two or three main stage productions and two to four studio productions each academic year. The national honorary theatre fraternity, Alpha Psi Omega, has an official chapter on the LHU campus. Internship opportunities are also available and can be customized to meet student's goals. Through the department, guest professionals in theatre visit to share their expertise with students, direct productions, and conduct workshops in the classroom.
