Mr. Hendershot came to provide insight about the recent parking complaints on campus. Interhall Council provided information to Mr. Hendershot regarding their current survey about parking. Some Questions and answers from this evening are as follows:

Q- In regards to 15 minute parking spots, how often are they being checked on?

A- There is no person employed specifically for parking regulations on campus. However, there are some spots that are under surveillance and most are checked regularly.

Q- Would it be possible to assign parking based on class standing?
(freshman, sophomore, etc)

A- While that is a good idea, this method results in more ticketing of younger students because they end up breaking the rules to get better parking anyhow.

Q- Why are there not more cameras in the parking lots for safety and ticketing purposes?

A- While there are projects in process to get more cameras, one camera costs between \$5,000-\$7,000. So it is more a money issue than anything else.

Most popular parking spots are SOMS, Gemmell, and shipping & receiving.
Main concerns are 15 minute parking, parking at Ralston, and parking lot maintenance.

Senator Custer motions to move \$4000 to the Common Read Program, Seconded by Senator Skunda.

Discussion: It is the goal of the Common Read Program to provide each freshman student a book to better acclimate them to the university through events in and outside the classroom. This years book is Falter by Bill McKibben, which deals with climate change. All professors will have the opportunity to implement the book into their curriculum.

The program would need \$15,000 to provide all 700+ incoming freshman the book. However, CSA can only provide \$4,000 due to a preexisting rule that limits their ability to spend money on activities of academic intent.

Senator Yost motions to suspend the decision. Senator Skunda seconds.

Discussion: Due to the preexisting rule, our contribution of \$4,000 would not be helpful to the Common Read Program.
