

Clarion University Student Senate Meeting Minutes
September 9, 2019

I. Call to Order

I had a meeting with Dr. Dale this past week and spoke about her upcoming goals for this year and plans for coming to our retreat. Her goals for senate this year are to focus on environmental sustainability. She would like to

see us work on starting another campus clean-up day. The Den on campus has closed permanently. This area will remain vacant. Dr. Dale is working on getting Stephens and Moore hall up to safety regulations. There will be a roll out opening for Tippin at the end of September. Graduation for this semester will still be held in Marwick Boyd Auditorium. Student Senate will hold another car election for Dr. Dale's new female companion car. There will be a BSGP conference call this Thursday (most likely to vote on new officers). Student Senate's retreat will be September 28th & 29th and Dr. Dale will be doing a one hour presentation for us. We will be holding an Applebee's fundraiser on September 12 from 11AM to 9PM. The university is looking for a new Ernie the Eagle. This is a paid position and they are looking for more than one person to work. The size of the costume is ideal for people who are 5'8-6'2. I. Student Trustee's Report- Trustee Zuzzio

- a. The first trustee meeting will be on September 19th at Venango Campus. The next meeting will be in November at Clarion Campus. Over the summer, I attended the all boards meeting in June. There they looked over the guidance of the university and the budget. In July, the Council of Trustees had their general meeting at Clarion Campus. There has been an increase in student population this year. There was a 14% increase (800 people), which resulted in the largest freshman class in ten years. They voted to freeze tuition rates for the upcoming school year. Similarly, Clarion university froze housing rates for the upcoming school year. We hired four new tenured professors. I will be going to Slippery Rock University tomorrow for the western regional conference. There we will be talking about how to improve the student trustee selection and involvement overall.

J. Faculty Senate Report- Senator Skunda

- a. I attended the first faculty senate for this school year. Dr. Hartly is now the interim associate provost. He is looking to renew and revamp the five-year program. Dr. Gent was unable to attend the meeting due to an event in Harrisburg. Dr. Laura Delbrugge, the new Dean of Arts and Sciences, wants to work on the relationship between the faculty and student body. Venango is working on phase one of revamping and renovating the library. Last spring, faculty senate passed a resolution on the open book resources.
