

Clarion University Student Senate Meeting Minutes
September 14, 2000

- I. Call to Order
 - A. President Mason called the meeting of the Fall 2020 semester of the Clarion University Student Senate to order at 7:30.
- II. Roll Call
 - A. Absent: Senator Joseph, Senator Minus, Senator Shepard, and Senator Yost
- III. Additions to the Agenda
 - A. There are no additions to the agenda.
- IV. Approval of the Minutes
 - A. The minutes were approved as presented.
- V. Student Concerns
 - A. Make sure you reach out to professors if you're having problems with your classes. If that doesn't help, please reach out to the Student Senate so that we can get you into contact with other people that can help you.
 - B. Some students have complained about the seemingly lack of basic training that some professors have had in regards to Zoom. Dr. Fenske explained that they'll work to send out another training session that professors can attend.
 - C. The internet connection has been extremely poor in the Suites on Main residence halls, particularly during popular class times.
 - 1. VP Boyle brought up the issue of students getting kicked out of synchronous classes during tests. In that case, should professors allow them to make up the tests asynchronously?
 - 2. If a student is kicked out of a class over Zoom, you must let your professor know because they will not always be able to tell if you were kicked out.
- VI. Officers' Reports
 - A. Vice President of Student Affairs - Dr. Fenske
 - 1. The pandemic situation is still being monitored on campus. There hasn't been a spike yet from Labor Day weekend, but it could come so students should remain careful.
 - a) 15 students have been tested and they have all been negative.
 - (1) The students are being extremely helpful and compliant with quarantining and whatnot.
 - b) 3 tests are still out, and waiting for results.
 - c) With off campus partying, concerns have been addressed.
 - 2. The basketball hoops behind Suites on Main South are being used as an area to take off masks so new signs are going up to remind people to wear their masks and to social distance.

3. Focus is starting to shift to Spring semester planning. If Clarion can make it a few more weeks, it will be easier to make some decisions towards reopening for some courses to be offered face to face.

 - (a) Other schools have been focusing on educating the faculty to trickle down to the students, so Clarion may be attempting to follow.

J. Faculty Senate - Senator Spang

1. Dr. Dale discussed the integration with Cal U today during the Faculty Senate meeting.
2. Due to the lack of funds, faculty size will be decreasing from 237 to 187. While there is a concern of growing class size, budget issues make the decrease in faculty necessary.
 - a) As of this year, Clarion has \$5.6 million in deficits. With the faculty decrease, Clarion would be up by \$186,700.
 - b) This decrease would be a line by line cut, not just academic.
 - c) The decrease is essential because the Chancellor wants the schools to have the same ratios of faculty to students from 2016, when there were a lot more students enrolled.
3. The University was given \$1.4 million for resources of technology and precautionary measures to keep the campus safe. There is talk of getting more backpack sprayers to put in classrooms.
4. With planning for the Spring, the faculty are planning for face to face classes just to be prepared.
