D. Rules and Regulations Committee - Vice President Engelmann

1. The Rules and Regulations committee moves to recognize BLM as an organization.
 - a) Discussion:

- (1) The primary purpose of the organization is to educate the campus and community on Black Lives Matter. While the campus seems like a diverse and accepting place, the community does not always seem that way, so they are hoping to build a bridge of connection with the students and the community.
- (2) How will this be different than clubs and organizations under Minority Student Services?
 - (a) There is hope to hold events, and to donate any profits to organizations that support Black Lives Matter. Hopefully, there will also be events held for the community as well as students. They would like to have more conversations that are directly linked to issues of Black Lives Matter.
- (3) The term “controversial” is used in the purpose statement of the constitution. Will there be more of a hope on compromise rather than controversial?
 - (a) This may have been included in a way to not silence issues and individuals. The purpose is more to have an understanding conversation rather than to prove sides of an argument.
- (4) How many members are there, and what are the plans for recruitment?
 - (a) There are currently five individuals participating actively in founding the organization. It has been difficult to recruit this semester, but the main plan will be to use mass emails and flyers.
- (5) What is the purpose in not including first semester freshmen?
 - (a) Anyone is welcome to general members, but for students to become true members will need to be second semester freshmen. This may be subject to change.
 - b) In order to form an organization there needs to be seven members. Because of this, the motion will be tabled until the club is able to get their member numbers up.
