

Clarion University Student Senate Meeting Minutes
March 29, 2021

- I. Call to Order
 - A. President Mason called the meeting of the Spring 2021 semester of the Clarion University Student Senate to order at 7:31.

 - a) COVID
 - (1) We have dealt with COVID for over a year now, and the university is following the state guidelines, CDC guidelines, and science with the process of reopening the university.
 - (2) Depending on what happens with any sort of surge, spread, or mutation, the university is going to open as much as possible, but there will be restrictions in regards to things like WINGO.

(3) There will still be student involvement on all of the committees dealing with COVID.

(a) Student input is really important.

(4) As much as Spring Break would have been lovely, it had to be cancelled due to COVID. A lot of students, faculty, etc. needed a day off because of the stress everybody has been under, so the university initiated the mental health day for Friday, April 2nd.

b) Mental Health

(1) The priority of mental health is going to continue next semester as well. These adjustments to the new normal will be weird for everyone, so we want to push a focus to it.

c) Integration

(1) The biggest concerns students have for integration are completion of programs, university names on diplomas, and programs being cut.

(a) There are students and other members on committees to cover all of this to make sure input is heard.

(b) The integration plans are to be presented to the Board of Governors soon.

(2) One of the big things for integration is to revamp the pedagogical approaches to teaching. Traditional teaching is great for some, but students are adapting and are more engaged in other ways.

(3) Integration would also allow for us to revamp student success programs. People need to be available for students and all of their questions on different issues when adjusting to college life.

d) Questions:

(1) There have been concerns brought up specifically about the history department essentially going away at Clarion.

(a) Dr. Dale mentioned she would look into questions like this. Programs being reworked across the three universities are being thoughtfully done.

(2) What will happen if there is a surge in cases next year?

(a) There will have to be a pivot to online, at least for a little while until cases go down.

(3) How did the decision for the mental health day for this Friday get made?

- (a) Students emailed multiple people simply expressing the need for a break.
 - (4) Could mental health days be set in future semesters?
 - (a) With the focus of mental health and wellness, that is definitely something that we will be considering.
 - (5) Could we be more transparent to students about bathroom issues for commencement?
 - (a) There will actually be bathrooms at commencement with ADA compliance.
