

Psychology Club BYLAWS

ARTICLE 1.- NAME

The name of this organization shall be the Psychology Club of Clarion University.

ARTICLE 2.-PURPOSE

Psychology Club is a RSO that is open to any and all students interested in learning about psychology and/or participate in psychology related activities. We often bring in guest speakers to tell us about their careers and experience. We also attend the annual Eastern Psychological Association (EPA) conference. Our goal is to provide Clarion University students with a club that provides education as well as fun psychology related activities.

ARTICLE 3.- MEMBERSHIP

Section 1.

Psychology club is open to anyone who has an interest in psychology. There is no GPA requirement and we welcome all students. The only requirement of membership is to attend two events held by the club per semester.

Section 2.

There are no membership fees but in the event that we plan something and need additional funding we will ask members to help out.

Section 3. Members can leave if they wish to do so.

ARTICLE 4.- DUTIES AND ELECTIONS OF THE OFFICERS

Section 1.

President: Fills out fundraising and volunteer forms, leads meetings, and keeps track of attendance at meetings and events.

Vice president: Assists the president in planning events and leads meetings when president is unavailable

Treasurer: Keeps track of funds, turns in fundraised money

Secretary: Sends out reminder emails and keeps a record of what is discussed at meetings

Advisor: Assists the officers and provides guidance when needed.

Section 2.

Officers are elected by a majority vote of club members. This occurs toward the end of the semester during one of our final meetings.

ARTICLE 5.- ROLE OF CAMPUS ADVISOR.

Section 1.

We ask someone in our department if they are interested in being our advisor. This ensures a smooth and effective process of our club.

Section 2.

A faculty/staff advisor shall provide advice and guidance on the exercise of responsibility, but shall have no authority to control the policy of the organization.

TICLE 6.- MEETINGS.

There are no membership dues. Funds will be requested from Student Senate when needed. All other funds come from fundraising and donations.

SECTION 8.- AMENDING. SUSPENDING. AND ACCEPTING.

Any changes to these Bylaws must be voted on by club members and the advisor. All changes to the Bylaws must be approved by the Student Senate, the Vice President of Student Affairs, and the President of Clarion University.

SECTION 9.- RATIFICATION.

These Bylaws, and its amendments, shall become effective upon ratification by the members of Psychology Club and following the approval of the Student Senate of Clarion University of Pennsylvania, the Vice President for Student & University Affairs, and the President of Clarion University.
