- (1) Reinhard Villages Internet Speed
 - (a) Original plan was to transition the wifi, but was postponed due to Covid. Will do a pilot program with Brooke Trout in spring to do a wireless connection from the community center to BT. Over the summer, redoing the trenches of the other villages. Boingo changed to WhiteSky but alert Todd Spaulding of internet concerns/difficulties tspaulding@clarion.edu
- (2) Why is Wifi at RV different from CU wifi?
 - (a) Third party connected to the cheap version of getting wifi and cable connected at the beginning of RV being built, but then CU leased from Foundations for it to get better eventually.
- (3) Survey will be sent out to RV residents about Xfinity streaming service and if it should still continue.
- (4) Dumpsters on roadways outside Laurel Glen are overflowing; however, dumpsters throughout villages are overflowing.
 - (a) The contract with the waste company collects the trash once a week, but will discuss with them to get it collected twice a week.
- (5) Is maintenance responsible for the entryways to look nice outside buildings at Reinhard?
 - (a) Before, student workers used to help tidy up. Residents are supposed to be responsible, but the K & K company is responsible for cutting grass and snow issues-attending grounds.
- (6) SOMS dorms have problems with the cooling system.
 - (a) JCI Contractors have to come in to fix it. There are still a few H-Vac systems down. Hilltop Suites will be switching out units, different system compared to SOMS
- (7) AC units in 2100 Whitetail are not working. Will heat work if the AC is not working?
 - (a) Continue to put in work requests. It could be just the cooling side of the system that is not working, so heat could work for when it comes time to use it.
- (8) Student complaints in RV about how some have shower tubs vs standing showers.
 - (a) Residents that live in 4x4's or lofts have shower tubs whereas those that live in 4x2's and 2x2's have standing showers.

- (1) Bento Sushi place has no staff. Quite understaffed, but workers are coming in to work in the next following weeks, along with student workers.
