It's All At The Fair

As summer gives way to fall there is a sense of excitement and friendliness in the heart of agricultural Columbia County. Soon farmers and city folk alike will be crowding the midways of the largest six-day fair in the United States and Canada.

It's time again for the Bloomsburg Fair. The quality of the entertainment and all the beauty of the buildings plus the many free presentations should once again have fair officials counting record setting crowds.

The beauty begins on the main promenade where five large permanent brick buildings house thousands of exhibits including flowers, fruits and vegetables, arts and crafts, hobbies and school projects.

Horticulture Hall can turn a sad face into a bright smile with the beauty of flowers and household plants. On display is row after row of every kind of house plants and flowers imaginable, along with special arrangements set up by area Garden Clubs.

Agriculture Hall displays the best fruits, grains, and vegetables grown during the season. In years past, a favorite attraction to many has been to view the giant pumpkins and squash brought in by some of the state's largest farms. The center isle is made up of exhibits by Grange organizations depicting the best of this year's harvest.

Next is the Arts and Crafts building. Here on exhibit is clothing, rugs, quilts, needlework, art work, ceramics and hundreds of other interesting displays. Also housed here is the Hobby Show and the Sewing Contest.

In the Industrial Building you will find the best achievements in the business and industry field. Manufacturers display the newest furnishings and equipment for the household or business.

Last, but not least, is the School Exhibit building. This building is used to display the achievements of elementary and secondary school students. Such displays include art work, hobbies, F. F. A., and F. H. A. work, shop exhibits and 4-H work.

On the biggest midway in the east will be Reithoffer's Carnival — "The Aristocrat of Show Business". Kiddieland (children's rides) will be at the western end of the fairgrounds.

Along the southwestern midway are modern buildings which house prize-winning animals including cattle, sheep and goats. These buildings are open all day and are free of charge to visitors. A large Arena provides for judging and special events such as the Horse and Pony Pulling Contests.

A favorite among the children are the hundreds of rabbits that are on display at the Rabbit show. There are also 296 breeds of Bantams and Chickens for show in the Poultry Show located near the western end of the Grandstand.

Nearby in pens are many breeds of

turkeys, ducks and geese. The Registered Dog Show offers a chance to see all varieties of dogs, including some that are very rare.

A recent addition to this great fair that has provided much entertainment for the youngsters is the free petting zoo. Many animals that are housed in zoo's are now out in the open for public petting.

There will be plenty of free entertainment at the Band Shell at various times throughout the day.

So, come be a part of one of the most exciting weeks Pennsylvania has to offer during the 129th presentation of the Great Bloomsburg Fair . . . and be on the lookout for Pete the ten foot clown.

Racing — Horse and Car — Demolition Derby

Spend a day at the races. Stake Harness Racing, Demolition Derby or the Midget Auto Races. The Bloomsburg Fair has it all.

12 o'clock noon is post time Monday through Thursday for the Stake Harness Horse Racing. The races feature the top 2 and 3 years olds in the nation and there will also be a powder puff race. Admission is free to the Grandstand with special acts in between races.

Friday the stage will be set for an almost unbelievable exhibition of motoring madness when George Marshman brings his world famous Demolition Derby to the Bloomsburg Fair.

This is an elimination contest where men with killer instinct seek to destroy all other cars on the speedway and keep his own running. This crash "em" for cash contest has no rules. The last man to make a hit and move his car 12 inches is the winner.

There will be four elimination contests limited to twenty-five cars each and a grand finale made up of the four elimination heat winners and the four that tried the hardest determined by the crowd. Also four cars will be picked by the officials.

If excitement is your cup of tea, then you shouldn't miss the thrills . . . a thousand thrills and a million laughs of a Demolition Derby.

Well, if you don't like horse racing or like watching people wreck cars but you do like the thrill of speed, then Saturday, October 1 is your day. The Midget Auto Races begin at 12:30 p.m. with Time Trials starting at noon. There will be three ten lap races, 1 four lap novelty race, a ten lap consolation race and the 30 lap feature race. Order your Grandstand tickets early for this one of the major events to take place during the spectacular Bloomsburg Fair.

Pre-View '83 Fair

The Bloomsburg Fair is proud to announce the signing of some of the biggest names in the entertainment business today, in keeping with the tradition of signing the best entertainment possible for the Grandstand shows.

Again this year, the Bloomsburg Fair gets underway with a spectacular star-studded Pre-Fair Country and Western Music Show on Saturday, September 24 at 8 p.m.

Performing at the Pre-Fair Country and Western Show will be Ronny Robbins and the Marty Robbins Band. Ronny, the son of the late Marty Robbins, bears a striking resemblance to his father both in looks and voice and stage appearance.

Also appearing with Ronny Robbins are two stars from Cornfield County, Hee Haw. Helen Cornelius, a high energy, classy and contemporary entertainer and Louis Marshall Jones, also known as Grandpa Jones will be entertaining.

And if that isn't enough, then Earl Thomas Conley, songwriter and performer who gained fame with his No. 1 song "Fire and Smoke" will also be performing at the Pre-fair Country and Western extravaganza.

Vesper Services at the Grandstand will be at 7 p.m., Sunday, September 25.

Long recognized as Senior Citizens Day, the Bloomsburg Fair officially opens Monday, September 26. The two Grandstand Shows will feature one of the most accomplished country music singers of all time. Charley Pride, with 38 albums and 43 singles under his belt, has gone on to establish himself as a country music giant in the 60's, a popular stage and

television entertainer in the 70's, and will continue to be an international star in the 80's. His performances will be a 5 p.m. and 7:30 p.m.

Tuesday, September 27 the country music spectacular continues with the sounds of the man who hit the top of the country charts with such songs as "Stand By Me" and "True Love Ways". He also is the owner of a huge honky tonk where the motion picture "Urban Cowboy" was filmed. The man is Mickey Gilley.

Along with Mickey Gilley will be Country Music's Female Vocalist of the Year, Sylvia. Her hit "Nobody" was the most requested song of the decade according to the DJ Association.

Tuesday through Saturday Grandstand Shows will be at 6 and 8:30 p.m.

Do the names Jimmy, Marie, Donny, Merrill, Jay, Alan and Wayne mean anything to you? Well, they are the members of the Osmond Family who will be performing Wednesday, September 28. For over two decades now they have made show business their career, ambition and hobby. The personalities that comprise this family makes up a

most unique blend of creative thinking and talent abilities.

Thursday, September 29, The Oak Ridge Boys, award winning superstars with great country hits like "Elvira" and "Bobby Sue" will be on hand to entertain the grandstand audiences. The Williams and Ree comedy team will also be performing Thursday evening. Terry Ree, an amusing 200 pound Sioux Indian and Bruce Williams will provide a fresh approach to entertainment and they are designated to reach the top in their field of endeavor.

Direct from San Francisco comes the Greg Kihn Band with their Number 1 hit "Jeopardy" for Friday, September 30th entertainment. Starting out alone in the music industry Greg Kihn has now found the right combination for a successful rock-n-roll group. The warm-up band for Friday's entertainment will be the local rock sensation Hybrid Ice.

What a better way to end a week of great entertainment than with the First Lady of Country Music and Mr. Country Rock. Tammy Wynette and Billy "Crash" Craddock team up to give a Saturday, October 1 finale to a great week of entertainment.

Log Sawing

Hey you lumberjacks . . . there's going to be a Log Sawing and Chopping Contest held on Saturday, October 1 at 11 a.m. at the Band Shell. No modified saws to be used. Regular stock models, and regular fuel mix. Cross cut saws must be American saws only. A chain saw may not be used by more than one person. Ribbons will be awarded to top three places only. There will be three competitions. 1. Chain Saws — 10 inches by 10 inches soft wood log, open class. 2. Two man cross cut 15 inch round oak log (per team). 3. Wood chopping 10 inch by 10 inch square soft wood log.

Garden Clubs

Located in the Flower Show Building are the beautiful displays by the Bloomsburg Area Garden Clubs. This year the general time is "Our State Heritage". Displays will be judged in four classes. 1. Mantle — "Our Churches". A design of fresh plant material. 2. Table — "Our Homes" — "Colonial Breakfast". A functional table — Colonial Breakfast of two place functional table settings. Fruit and flower arrangement. 3. High Pedestal — "Our Resources". A Dried Arrangement. 4. Low Pedestal — "Our School". A combination of dried and fresh plant material.

Accessories are acceptable in or with all arrangements.

Registered Dog Show

A very popular feature of the Bloomsburg Fair is the Registered Dog Show, open to anyone wishing to enter their particular breed.

All dogs entered must show proof of registration at the time of entry. No entry or pen fee is charged.

Since this is an Amateur and Breeders Show, and not a point Show, you may advertise your kennels and sell dogs at no charge.

Trophies are awarded to first place winners. Special award of trophy and ribbon for best dog and best puppy in the Show.

Special trophy awarded to dogs that have shown in AKC circuit only. Puppies must be six months old to be entered in puppy class for judging.

Closing date for entries is September 10. Judging will take place on Sunday, September 25 at 9 a.m.

All-Pro Rodeo

Saddle up your hoss and head west young man . . . well just head to the Bloomsburg Fair on Saturday afternoon, September 24 for the All-Pro Genuine Rodeo. Some of the best cowboys in the business will be on hand to try to test their strength against the strength of the animals.

The most popular rodeo riding event, and the most dangerous, is bull riding. Many of the big cross-bred Brahmas go a whole season without being ridden the required 8 seconds.

Team roping fast gaining in popularity, has two basic techniques — Dally Team Roping and Team Tying. In Dally Team Roping, the header ropes the Steer's horns then quickly turns him. Immediately the second rider ropes the steer's hind legs and dallies his rope on the saddle horn.

Steer Wrestling is probably the most exciting event in Rodeo games. When a man drops from a galloping horse onto the steer, stops the steer and throws him to the ground, spectators have seen skill overcome heavily weighted odds.

Calf Roping is a race against time with seconds counted in decimal points. To win, horse and rider must work together with precision teamwork.

These events plus a few others will provide plenty of action and excitement for those who have the cowboy spirit in them. Don't miss a good time, come out and watch the All-Pro Genuine Rodeo at the Bloomsburg Fair.

F.F.A. — F.H.A.

Along with the many rides, the fantastic food, the great entertainment there are many demonstrations and competitions that don't get the highlight that other attractions do.

These demonstrations will be done by students in Home Economics or Vocational Agriculture classes in the high schools of Columbia, Montour and Sullivan Counties. The demonstration must be at least fifteen minutes long but no more than twenty minutes. They may cover any topic that is taught as part of their curriculum.

Sewing Contest

For the homemakers there is a Sewing Contest. To be eligible an adult must enter all five classes at the Fair. They are 1. Ladies Dress (with set-in sleeves) 2. Stuffed Toy 3. Luncheon Set or Crib Quilt 4. Man's Shirt or Pajamas 5. Kitchen Apron and one Potholder. Each exhibit will be judged on workmanship, worth of article, appropriateness of material and design.

In addition to cash prizes for first, second and third places, the grand prize an Oster "Food Crafter" will be given the contestant receiving the greatest number of first places.

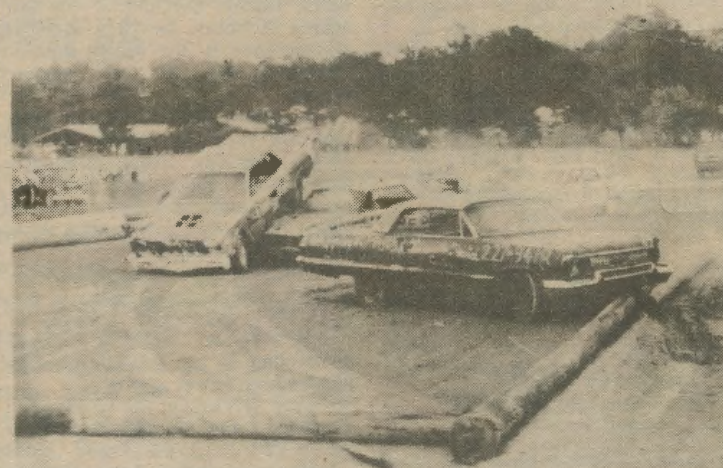
